
be framed, or at least matted, ready for hanging, and brought to the Library on September 30 or October 1.

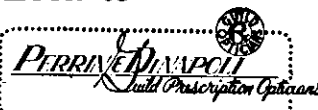
