
Christmas lighting of homes throughout the Town of Bethlehem will be judged by Mrs. Vir-


be set up at the Town Hall, and Bill Weber is putting up a new star behind it, contributed by the Chamber of Commerce to symbolize the Town of Bethle-







# AMBULANCE COMMITTEE REPORTS FUND PROGRESS, EXPLAINS INSURANCE

The Ambulance Committee of the Delmar Fire Department reports that a great many contributions have already been received toward purchase of a new Rescue Squad Ambulance . . . but many more are still needed.

The Committee has asked The Spotlight to clarify the question of insurance. At the time of the initial appeal a couple of weeks ago, it was estimated that only about \$4,000 could be realized from insurance on the wrecked vehicle. Subtracting this from the figure of \$13,800 for a new one left \$9,800 to be raised.

Since then, a settlement of \$5,400 has been made by the insurance company. This means that "only" \$8,400—a thousand dollars less than anticipated — must be obtained.

The Ambulance Committee's

expenses for printing, postage and stationery were \$489. This amount was contributed by the Fire Department and will not be deducted from contributions. All money raised will be used for the ambulance itself or for ambulance service. (We stated last week that every cent would go toward purchase of a new vehicle, but a member of the Department has pointed out that it is vitally important to keep up the working stock of first aid equipment and that any money above the cost of the vehicle itself would go in a special fund for this purpose.)

"But these Players are troupers. Not a line was flubbed . . . the show went on!"


