UNUSUAL PROGRAM AT BCHS NEXT TUESDAY

In a public meeting, the Bethlehem Central Junior-Senior High School Steering Committee is sponsoring Major William E. Mayer's tape-recorded speech, "Communist Indoctrination — Its Significance to Americans," Tuesday, Feb. 23, at the Senior High auditorium beginning at 3:00 P.M.

An instructor in neuro-psychiatry at the U.S. Army Medical Service School, Fort Sam Houston, Major Mayer is considered one of the foremost authorities on Communist "brainwashing." As a top psychiatrist on the prisoner-study project in Japan, he interviewed and examined the complete records of more than 1,000 American soldiers released from prisoner-of-war camps in Korea.

[Note: People who have heard this tape have told us that it is fascinating. We wonder why such a deeply-revealing, thought-provoking program could not be scheduled, somehow, for an evening hour when more of us might attend. — Editor.]

LEARN-TO-DRIVE COURSE OFFERED

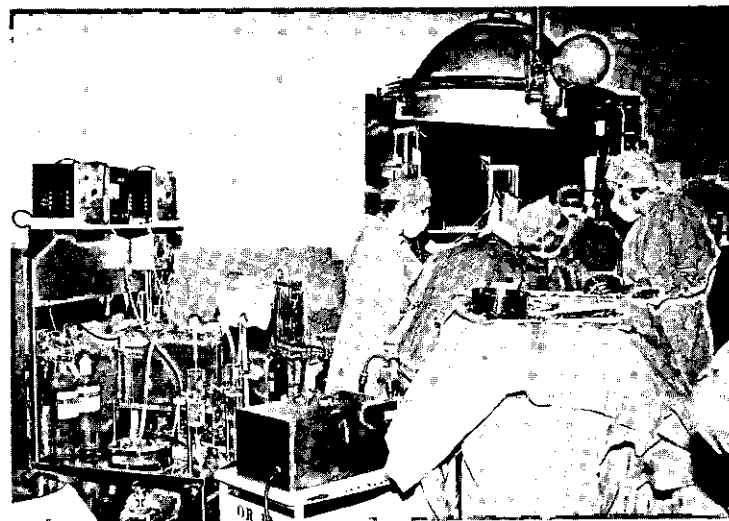
