SLINGERLANDS 4-H GIRLS MAKE PROGRESS IN COOKING PROJECT

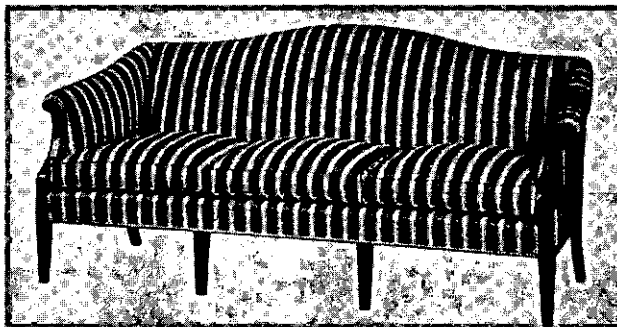

GLENMONT PTA'S SQUARE DANCERS TO HOLD GRADUATION TWIRL

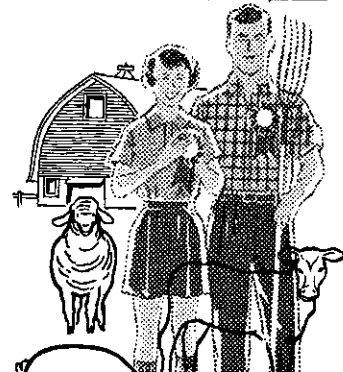

wheel chair, or even a hospital bed? These items and many others are available on a loan basis to residents of the Town of Bethlehem as one of the many services of the Albany County Chapter American Red Cross.

In 1949 the local chapter established a loan closet, well stocked with supplies for home care of the ill and the invalided. Since the inception of the program eleven years ago, Mrs. Gardner F. Parks, then vice-chairman of the Delmar Branch of the American Red Cross, has housed this equipment in her home at 38 Roweland Avenue and has been in full charge of its care and distribution. Requests for sick room supplies come to Mrs. Parks either directly from the patient or a member of his family or are made by the family physician. Last year alone, thirty families availed themselves of this service.

All requests are filled, providing that the required article is on hand or can be obtained

from headquarters, without regard to the financial status of the patient, and no charge is ever made for the use of the articles. Patients may keep the supplies as long as the need exists.

Basic needs of the closet were furnished by the Red Cross at the time of its establishment and have been replenished and added to as requirements of the community have necessitated. Funds for their purchase are derived from the monies raised during the annual campaigns, such as the one now in progress.

Among the items available are bed trays and bedside tables; bed pans, urinals, commodes; bedding, including rubber sheets, electric pads and disposable bed pads; canes and crutches of assorted sizes, including children's; a child's walker, side boards for the bed, blanket support, back rests, and a collapsible wheel chair. Other wheel chairs and hospital beds may be obtained through the chapter house. Grateful patients and friends of the Red Cross often donate supplies to augment this stock. The "Loan Closet" is but one of the many ways in which Red Cross contributes to the needs of the community.

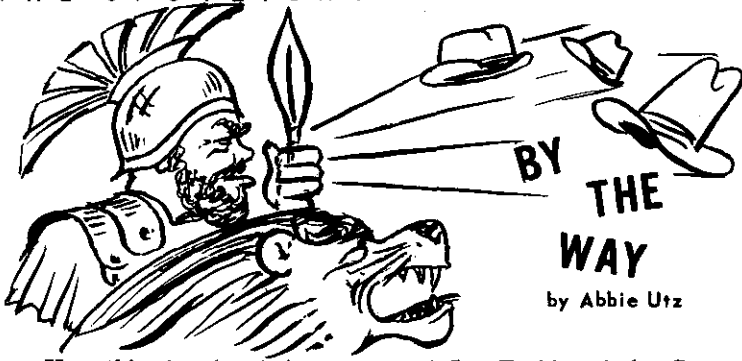

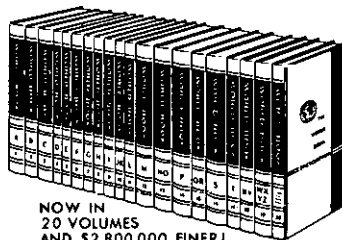

Do you occasionally meet some do-it-yourselfers who make you feel you really aren't getting much done? We did just recently . . . They are the Paul Falkners of Ravena, N. Y. — campers, Cub Scouts, Boy Scouts, and hunters extraordinary!

Our meeting came as a result of a mutual interest in Scouting, through Cub Pack #57 of Ravena. Here Mr. Falkner is Cubmaster, having taken that post in an established pack of 8-to-11-year-old boys over 6 months ago. There are 10 dens and boys are organized into neighboring groups from Cedar Hill to Ravena.

Out of the conversation we learned of Mr. Falkner's original interest in Scouting, springing from his boyhood love of the outdoors and camping. He started several years ago as Scoutmaster of Troop #57 Ravena. When that roster became filled last year, he pitched in to organize a new troop and recruited leadership to keep it operating. By finger count or any other kind, we came up with about 150 boys who have come into direct contact with the enterprising Falkner family. Remember, please too, that in terms of time, this is all extra-curricular.

Naturally our visit turned to hunting and camping . . . Well, these Falkners were avid cy-

clists until three years ago. Now with three children they consider camping and travel a family activity. Last year they spent 35-odd nights outdoors as a group and Father logged almost as many more at Scout Camp in Vermont. To facilitate camping trips, Paul built his own trailer, complete with storage area, built-in kitchen with stove, sink and cabinets. When you travel, feed, clothe and sleep 5 people, you'd better go equipped! Tent, poles, utensils, lanterns and first-aid are all part of the accoutrement.

Along with camp life, the Falkners are currently raising a 5-month old setter. He will, of course, be trained to hunt, as have other dogs in the past few years. The evidence of guns and bows and arrows about the house indicated more than a passing interest. The Falkners hunt for deer and smaller game and all three children are learning to handle bows and arrows. Further observations brought out many outstanding trophies imprinted with Mrs. Falkner's name.

Perhaps by now our readers may think our ambitious neighbors are semi-retired. But not so; early any morning 6 days a week in the Ravena Post Office, both Mr. and Mrs. Falkner are employed. What a family! Tremendous energy with these interests and hobbies . . .

Theirs is real community spirit. Our hats are off to these

sincere working people who are contributing so much to the youth of their entire neighboring area of Ravena . . .

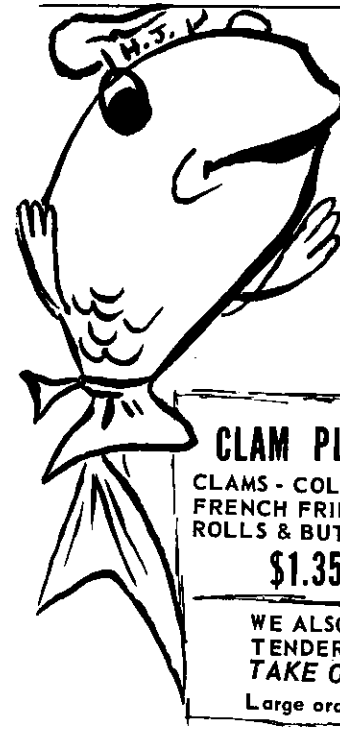

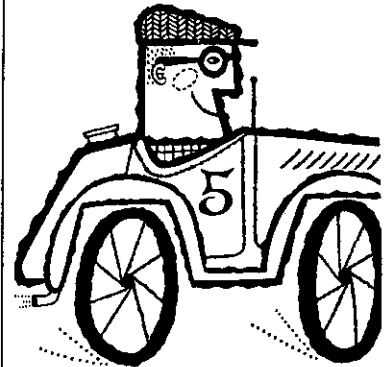
