NEW BOARD MEMBER TO BE CHOSEN AT MAY 3, MEETING

At 7:30 P.M. on May 3, residents of the area will gather at Bethlehem Central Senior High School for the Bethlehem Central School District's annual meeting.

Highlighting the meeting will be the election of a new Board of Education member to fill the vacancy which will be created by the retirement of William Zimmerman, board president, who is not a candidate for reelection.

Two Slingerlands residents are candidates for the position. They are Dr. Robert K. Bair, 5 Greenwood Lane, and John Clark, 1480 New Scotland Road. Each has prepared a brief statement and personal history for *The Spotlight* and we are printing these, below, exactly as received.



JOHN CLARK

John Clark is 45, father of two children attending the Bethlehem School System, a graduate of Fordham University and employed as a Methods Engineer by the New York Telephone Company. He served with the artillery in Europe during World War II, and has resided in Slingerlands for 14 years. He is a member of the Slingerlands Community Players and the Slingerlands Community Methodist Church choir.

From 1954 to 1957 he worked with various Citizens Advisory Committees on matters of finance, teacher aide programs, sizes of classes and teachers' salaries. In 1958 he was a contributor to the Rand Committee report on curriculum needs for the expanded Senior High School.

He had two statements to make in the space allowed:

Robert K. Bair, a chemist at Sterling-Winthrop Research Institute since 1944, attended Juniata College (B.S. in chemistry, 1940) and Northwestern University (Ph.D. in organic chemistry, 1943). He has two children in Bethlehem Central schools. Since 1944 he has been an active member of Calvary Methodist Church, Albany.

He was a New York State delegate to two White House Conferences, one on Education in 1955 and one on Children and Youth a month ago. For the past ten years he has actively supported public schools on citizens' committees and P.T.A.'s, and in his profession. This past year he has served on the Bethlehem Central Budget Advisory Committee and, with Mrs. Bair, on the Parents' Steering Committee of the Bethlehem Central Junior High School, and

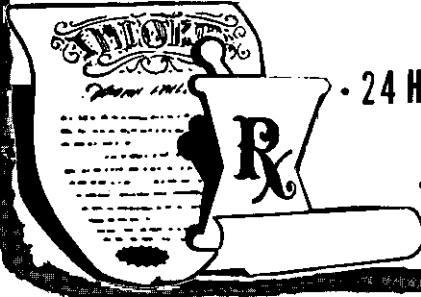

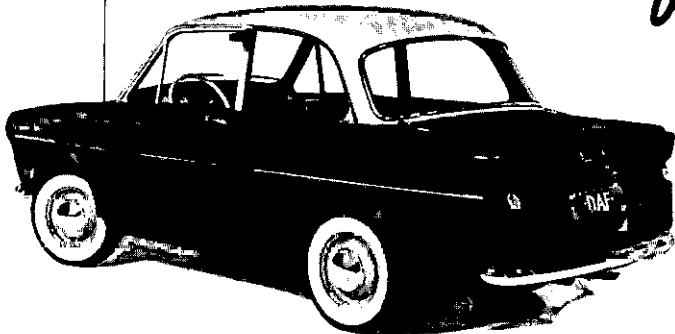

others. The Delmar Antique Study Group will also have an exhibit.


