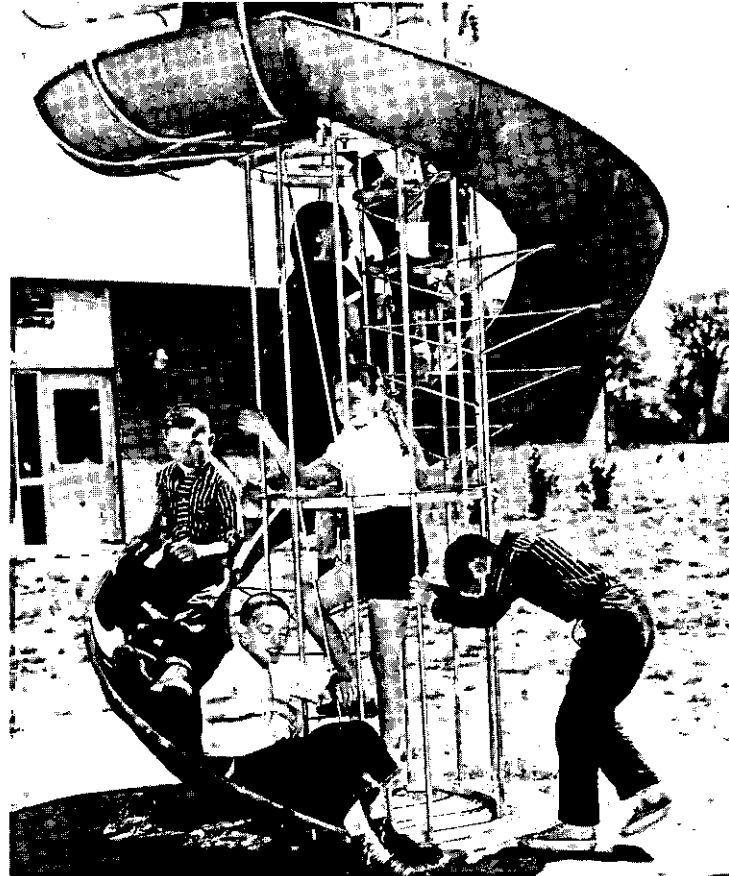

For the teenagers and the out-of-school youth, outdoor basketball leagues are being planned. The leagues will be (continued on next page)

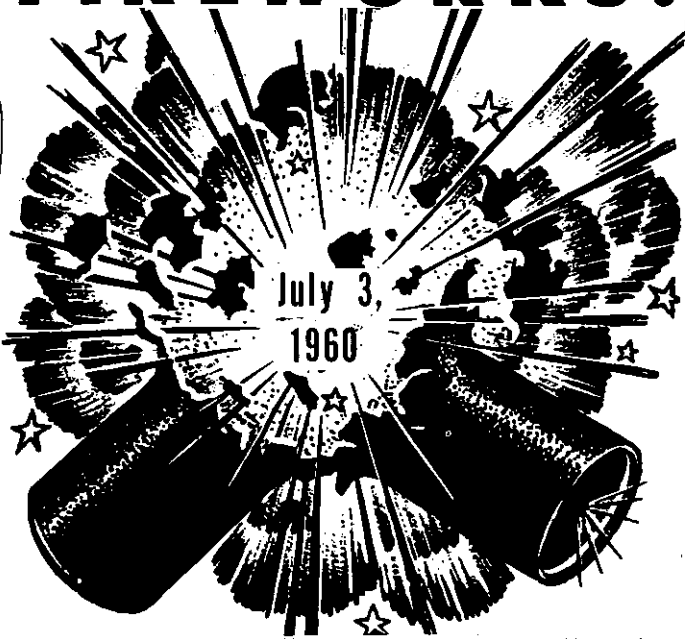

There will be several outdoor dances and roller skating parties scheduled for this summer. These times and dates will be announced later.

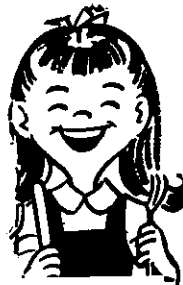
