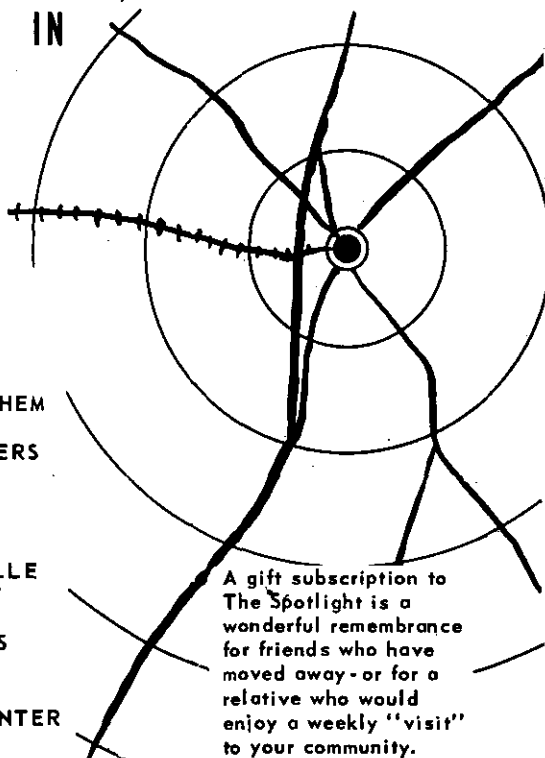
pictures, etc. for the offset printer's cameras on Tuesday. Obviously, if we were to accept copy later than Thursday, we'd never get anywhere.
