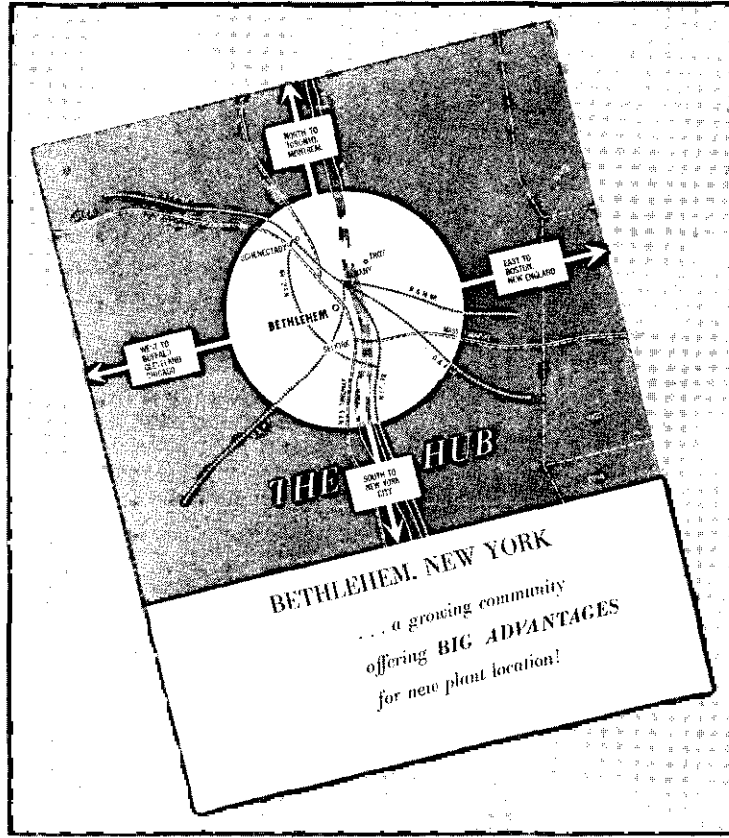

SCHOOL DISTRICTS SCHEDULE SERIES OF WORKSHOPS

Workshops for kindergarten through grades three will be held at the Bethlehem Central Senior High School, Delmar, under the leadership of Mrs. Nina Woessner on Thursday, September 8. On the basis of a survey of teacher interest, groups have been set up in citizenship education, science, educational law, arithmetic, art, creativity in kindergarten and grade one, slow learners, and language skills. Nine consultants recruited from education and industry will be present for the all day meeting.
