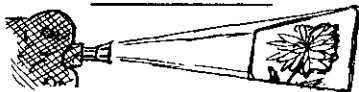

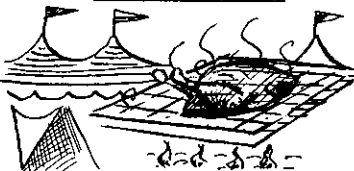

We forgot to ask Mrs. Williams how far the Chamber plans to pursue the subject, but we agree that civic messiness is annoying. In New York City, you know, they have finally cracked down on street litterers and will fine you up to \$25 for throwing your Crackerjack box onto the macadam.

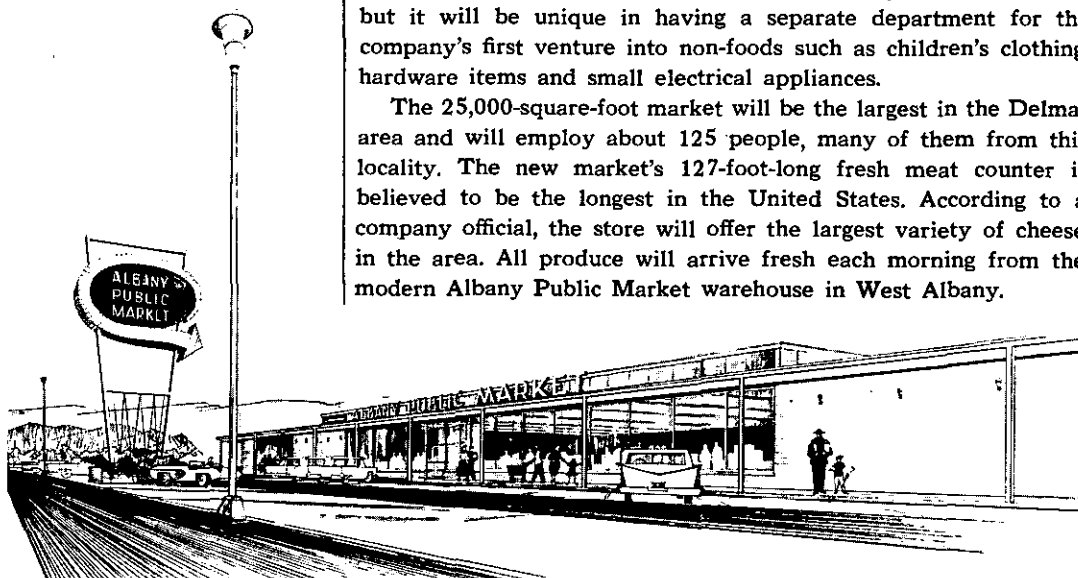

## HUGE NEW MARKET WILL OPEN SOON IN DELMAR

The third store in the Albany Public Markets, Inc. expansion program will open early in September on Delaware Avenue, Delmar.

According to Frank J. Nigro, executive vice-president, the newest store will carry all the high quality and name-brand meats, groceries and merchandise of the other Albany Public Markets, but it will be unique in having a separate department for the company's first venture into non-foods such as children's clothing, hardware items and small electrical appliances.

The 25,000-square-foot market will be the largest in the Delmar area and will employ about 125 people, many of them from this locality. The new market's 127-foot-long fresh meat counter is believed to be the longest in the United States. According to a company official, the store will offer the largest variety of cheese in the area. All produce will arrive fresh each morning from the modern Albany Public Market warehouse in West Albany.

available. They emphasize that the length of mortgage should be governed by a man's earning power over a 30-year period and his ultimate potential. They are skeptical of the real-estate trend toward "trading-in" old homes on the purchase of a new one, but are interested in more information about this practice.

When they buy their "ideal home," it could cost \$5,000 to \$15,000 more than their present home. If they could remodel their present home as they would like to have it, they might spend from \$3,000 to \$15,000. Most women would spare no expense in remodeling their kitchens, agreeing to pay up to \$5,000 exclusive of structural alterations to get it "perfect."


per se, all feel that their present homes have increased in value due to improved localities, increased land values and the addition of rooms or modernization of kitchens.

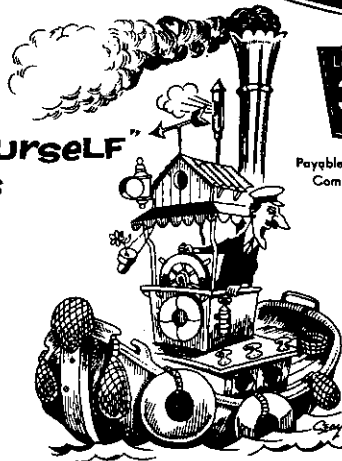

**FOOD FORUM STIRS LIVELY DEBATES**

Delegates described a quality food as "a fine one of its kind," and said they judge a quality dish by the way it tastes, its appearance, its smell and the way it's served.
