

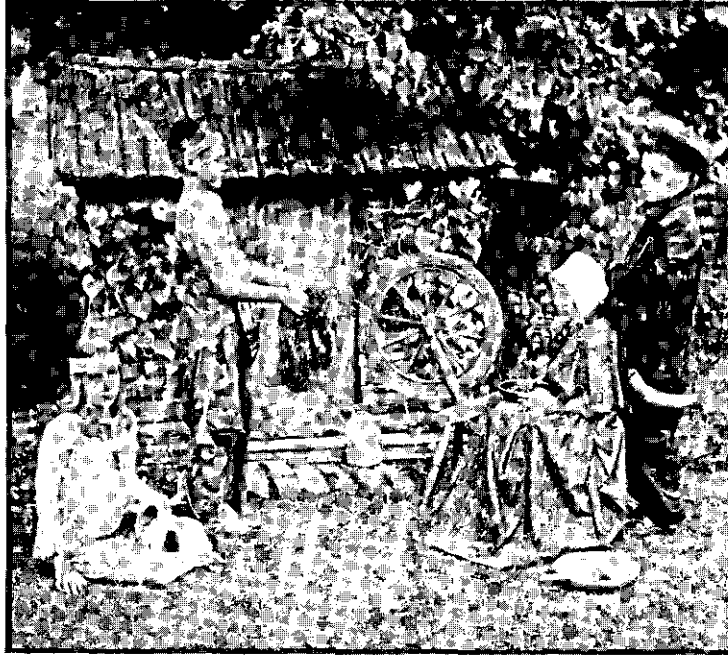

At the Manor House and Trading Post they may purchase plants and rugs, aprons and doll clothes, Christmas gifts, slightly used trade goods including bric-a-brac, clothes for all the family and children's toys. Chuck wagons along the route, says our trusty scout, will be loaded with baked goods that have a delicious home-made flavor, melt-in-your-mouth candy, preserves and canned foods and fresh produce. Friendly "Indians" will offer ice cream, soda and snacks instead of snatching scalps.

There will be thrilling rides in the stagecoach, maybe even a hold-up, and kiddies will find ponies just begging for young cowboy-and-cowgirl riders, as well as chair-o-plane rides from a modern frontier.

There is no entry fee and there are no awards — although Mrs. Rowe says wistfully that there would be no serious objection if local organizations, service clubs or businesses wished to establish an award or two.

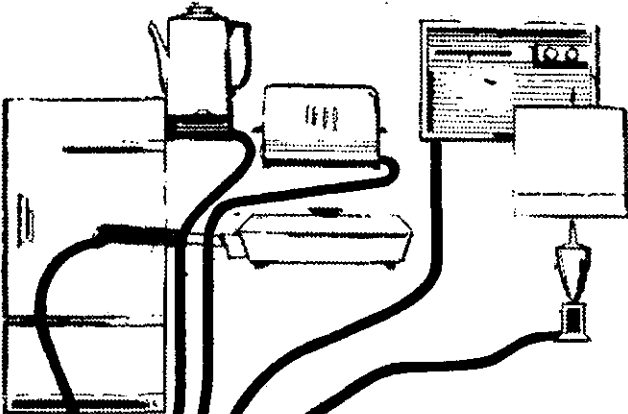
