

## DELMAR FIRE DEPARTMENT OFFERS FREE RESCUE MARKERS FOR HOMES

Chief Blake Case of the Delmar Fire Department announces that rescue markers are available for placement on the homes of the aged, blind, bedridden and handicapped in our community.

These markers are made of a special red-and-black fluorescent material that will glow in the beam of a spotlight at night and attract the immediate attention of firemen in the event of fire. The markers will say, in effect, "Firemen, special care is needed here! An aged or handicapped person lives in this house." Faster, safer rescues will thus be possible, as the successful experience of other communities has shown.

There is no charge whatever for these markers. They are part of the volunteer Department's service to all of us. Anyone interested in obtaining them should call Chief Case at HE 9-1701 or one of the assistant chiefs: Charles Sutter, HE 9-9677; Edward Pakenham, HE 9-3522 or Paul Woodin, HE 9-1203.

One of these officers will then call at your home and place the markers on the front and rear doors and on the door and window of the handicapped person's room.

The adhesive backing of the markers sticks firmly to wood, metal or glass but pulls away cleanly, when desired, without marring the surface underneath.

The danger of air pollution was recently pointed out by State Health Commissioner, Dr. Herman E. Hilleboe. At the same time Mr. Arthur J. Twice a member of my family has had to be in the hospital in an oxygen tent because of such thoughtlessness. Even without an allergy the smoky, smoggy nights render it impossible to sleep and certainly according to these two authorities are a menace to health.

Won't all of you join in alleviating the suffering of some of your fellow townspeople?

The Grange will hold a food sale on the Grange premises on Election Day. All kinds of delicious baked goods and other items will be on sale.



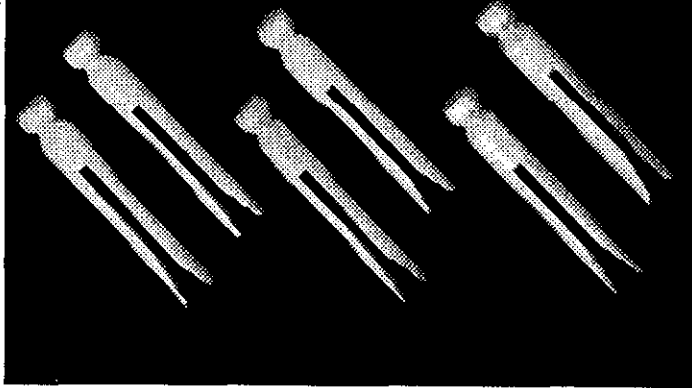
### TALENTED "MONO-ACTOR" TO ENTERTAIN AT FIRST MEETING OF PROGRESS CLUB, ON OCT. 10
