PLAYERS' "JUNO" PROMISES TREAT FOR TRI-VILLAGERS

At 8:40 P.M. Friday evening, the curtain will part on the BCHS stage and hundreds of Tri-Villagers will be transported to the home of Juno and Captain Jack Boyle — "a struttin' paycock of a man" — in a tenement house in Dublin. They will laugh and thrill to one of the finest plays written in the 20th century: *Juno and* — who else? *The Paycock!*

Seldom produced by amateurs because it requires top-

flight acting and directing, *Juno and the Paycock* will be presented by The Slingerlands Community Players, one of the best amateur companies in the business, who have plenty of both. The Players will launch their ninth consecutive season with two performances; Friday and Saturday, Oct. 28 and 29, both at 8:40 P.M. at Bethlehem Central Senior High School.

Juno is a lively, rowdy, moving story of a Dublin family — hilarious and tragic — in the troubled days following the formation of the Irish Free State. Author Sean O'Casey writes with wicked humor, warmth and sympathetic understanding of the Dubliners among whom he himself was born, lived and worked. His play is richly Irish and his characters are full of folly, mock-heroics... and beau-

AREA YOUNGSTERS TO CONTINUE HALLOWE'EN TREAT TO AID NEEDY

For the fourth consecutive year, the young people of our community will combine the ancient customs of Hallowe'en with the modern idea of help to children in many troubled lands of the world. Once again, UNICEF "Trick-or-Treaters" will come to our doors for our "treat" to the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund. The young collectors will wear an identifying arm band or tag to show that they are part of the nation-wide effort of American children to aid programs of disease control, improved nutrition and health services in needy areas of the world.

UNICEF collections are the newest and most unselfish holiday tradition in our land. All children and high school students in the Tri-Village are urged to join this worthy project and it is hoped that residents will contribute as generously as they have in the past three years. The Bethlehem Police Department has promised co-operation, as always, in protect-

A \$500,000 contract for reconstruction of a 1.4 mile section of Delaware Ave. (Route 43) in The Town of Bethlehem, Albany County, from a two-lane to four-lane highway will be up for bids on December 9, according to State Superintendent of Public Works J. Burch McMorran.

Mr. McMorran's announcement followed the latest of a series of meetings between Department officials and Bethlehem Supervisor Bertram E. Kohinke on the need to improve the main route through the township.

The project will begin south of the Normanskill Creek viaduct near the Albany city line and extend westward to Hudson Ave., Elsmere. The new highway will have a paved width of 48 feet, including a two-foot flush mall in the center. The present pavement is 20 to 24 feet wide.

The widening will require very little new right-of-way, and will not disturb buildings along the route.

Included in the project will be the installation of curbing
