## BETA GAMMA RHOMMAGE SALE ON DEC. 9, 10

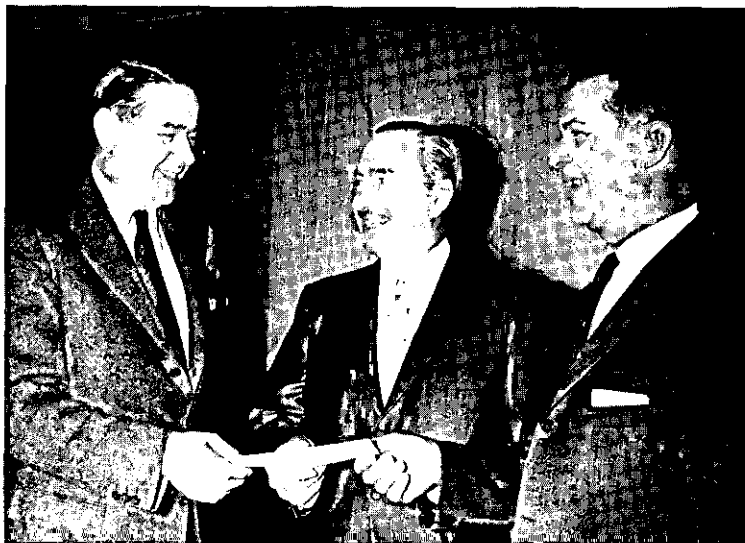
