This year's Ambassador will be sent either to Sweden or to Brazil for part of July and August. All costs of the Ambassadorship are borne by the Bethlehem Community Ambassador Project


The Community Ambassador Project sends a representative of the Bethlehem community to live with a family abroad, to travel in that foreign country during the summer, and during the year following his return, to share experiences with the Bethlehem community. Designed to promote international understanding, this nationwide project is sponsored and financed locally by individuals and service organizations in the Town of Bethlehem, by the New York State Adult Education Division and by the Experiment in International Living.

An applicant for Sweden must be between 18 and 35; for Brazil, 19-35; and have completed at least the sophomore year of college. The Ambassador must be a resident of Bethlehem and must agree to be available for speaking engagements in Bethlehem during the year following the foreign visit. No foreign language skill is required; rather, a keen interest in people, a desire to contribute to mutual foreign understanding, and an ability to adapt to new ways of living are important qualifications.



April is National Cancer Month, it was announced by Millerd G. Larkin, Tri-Village chairman for the annual cancer crusade. Wednesday, April 19, has been designated for the "Lights On" campaign when 200 volunteers in the Tri-Village Area will solicit donations to the work of the American Cancer Society. (It should be noted that this is one day later than the date when the cancer crusade will be conducted in the City of Albany. This is to avoid conflict with the annual parents meeting at BCSHS on the 18th.)

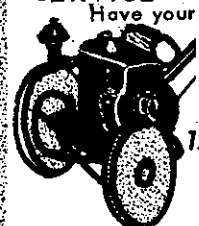
Cancer is second of the leading causes of death in America, heart diseases being first. About 265,000 Americans died of cancer last year — 726 every day — one man, woman or child every two minutes! At the present rate, cancer will strike one in four Americans now living . . . UNLESS something is done about it.

And something is being done about it. The research attack on cancer is the greatest and costliest single undertaking in medical history. One cancer patient in three is now being saved. There are now over one million Americans alive today who have been cured of cancer. By "cured" is meant that they are alive without evidence of the disease at least five years after diagnosis and treatment.

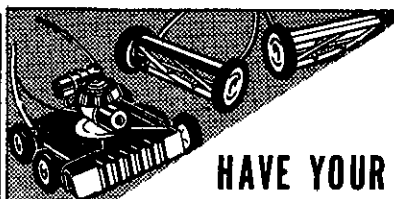

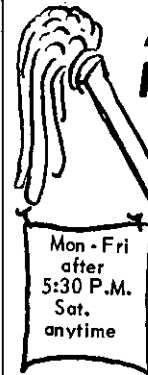

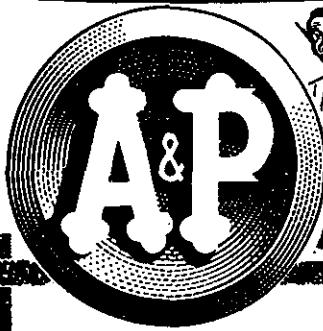

will also be presented.

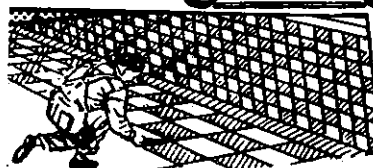
