3 CANDIDATES ENTER SCHOOL BOARD RACE; VOTING AT MEETING MAY 2

Three Tri-Village residents are entered in Board of Education post being vacated by Board President Catherine Van Volkenburgh. The election will be a part of the annual meeting scheduled for May 2 at the Senior High School.

The announced candidates are Herbert G. Drew, 19 Douglas Road; Mrs. Eleanor P. Alexander, 20 Forest Road; and Lindsay M. Boutelle, 27 Lyons Avenue.

Mr. Drew is chief accountant for McKesson and Robbins, Inc., of Albany, and a member of the Delmar Presbyterian Church where he is a ruling elder, trustee, building fund treasurer and insurance chairman. He is a past commander of Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post, American Legion, and is secretary of its board. A graduate of Cornell University, he is married and the father of a son and daughter.

Mrs. Alexander, a former

schoolteacher and mother of five, is the wife of Dr. Robert S. Alexander, a member of faculty of Albany Medical College. She was graduated from Mount Holyoke College where she majored in science and later was a graduate assistant to the faculty. She has served on the advisory committee to the Board of Education.

Mr. Boutelle is associated with his father in the firm of Edward M. Boutelle and son, engineers and surveyors. He is a graduate of Bethlehem Central High School and Duke University and served in the Air Corps in World War II. He is past president of Bethlehem Lions Club and a former director of the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce. He is married and the father of two children. Mr. Boutelle is a member of Bethlehem Reformed Church; Bethlehem Lodge, F & AM; and Treasurer of the BCSHS Alumni Association.

The production of "Hotel Paradiso" on Friday and Saturday, April 28 and 29, at Bethlehem Central High School will represent one of the most ambitious undertakings to date for the Slingerlands Community Players.

The three-act French farce by Georges Feydeau and Maurice Desvallieres will have a total cast of about 40 persons, including many extras who romp through the scenes and compound the confusion.

Termed a "mad French bedroom frolic" by the New York Journal-American when it was presented on Broadway during the 1956-57 season, the play calls for a wide assortment of costumes to reflect the Paris of 1910 and demands the most split-second timing on the part of the cast to spice the comic situations.

Curtain time will be at 8:40 p.m. in the school auditorium. A French theme will prevail throughout the production with appropriate lobby decorations and attractions, including an artist on hand to sketch playgoers and an exhibition of paintings by area artist arranged by Clover Mikol and Gladys Bastian.

A special performance will be presented on Thursday, April 27, without cost, for members of the Delmar senior citizens group and patients at the Veterans Administration hospital in Albany.

Directed by Martin P. Kelly, "Hotel Paradiso" shows what happens when a hen-pecked husband attempts to have a love affair with the self-pitying wife of his business partner in a disreputable hotel.

Leading roles in the comedy will be played by Charles Losacco, Ellen Heenehan, Lois Morrison and Richard Harris.

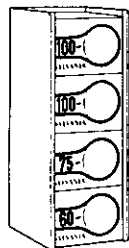
CANCER FUND REPORT
