BOUTELLE WINS PLACE ON BETHLEHEM SCHOOL BOARD

Lindsay M. Boutelle of 27 Lyons Avenue, Delmar, was elected to the Bethlehem Central School Board after a spirited campaign which brought out 2228 voters, highest for any school board election in the town's history. He succeeds Mrs. Catherine VanVolkenburgh whose term on the board expired this year and who was not a candidate for re-election.

Mr. Boutelle won election over two other candidates -- Mrs. Robert S. Alexander, and Herbert G. Drew. None of the candidates had a majority of the votes cast at the first election following the board's annual meeting. In that vote, Mr. Boutelle received 637; Mrs. Alexander, 517, and Mr. Drew, 314.

Prior to a run-off election, Mr. Drew withdrew as a candidate. In the run-off, Mr. Boutelle received 1327 of the total vote, Mrs. Alexander, 881. There were 20 void ballots counted.

The new member joins the school board in July. He is associated with his father in the

practice of civil engineering and surveying in the Town of Bethlehem of which he has been a lifelong resident.

Saturday, May 20th will be the opening day of the 1961 little league baseball season in the tri-village area. The day will be marked by colorful pre-game ceremonies and interesting Major and Intermediate games.

The village Fife and Drum Corp and little leaguers officially will begin the day with flag raising ceremonies at 1:15 p. m. at Magee Park. Over 450 youngsters will participate in the league this year. Beginners will play in the Klerisy league.

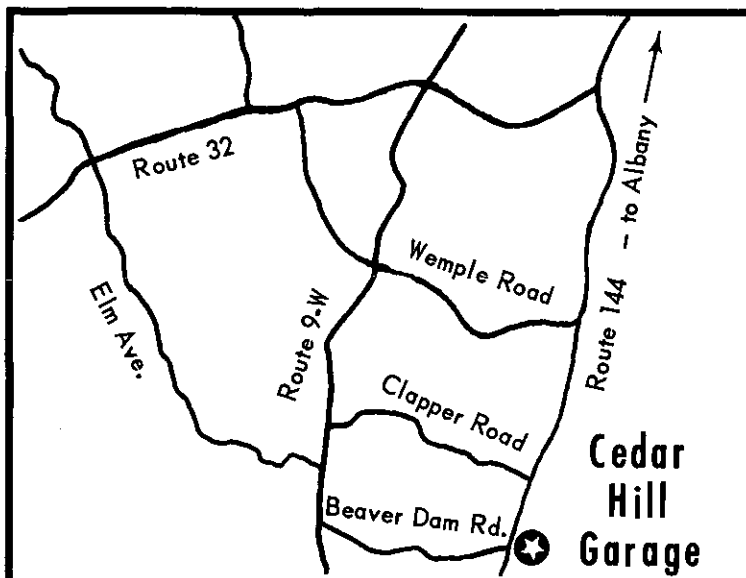

pain and eventually bleeds to death internally. Having made inquires at three local hardware stores we have learned that MOLE NOTS and ANT TRAPS contain thallium. These poisons are clearly labeled with a skull and crossbones. One store does not sell either of these items simply because they are so lethal. At another store we were told that there is a more effective method of getting rid of moles' which does not involve this poison.

Since this problem is becoming increasingly prevalent, we hope that in the not too distant future legislation will be enacted making the indiscriminate use of these commercial poisons a criminal offense. These poisonings have been reported to the local authorities and the Humane Society.

Look to your own neighborhood - these labels read, "Poisonous to pets AND CHILDREN."
