Father Schommer was a scholarship student at the Juilliard School of Musical Art before entering the Society of Jesus. He is presently an instructor of Theology at Canisius College.


Barbara Cashier studied vio-







Salvation Army Fund Drive On


The Annual Fund Drive for the Salvation Army is now being carried on in the Tri-Village Area. About 100 women are conducting a house to house canvass.






