## LETTERS

To Bethlehem Residents:

Last weekend I read in an Albany newspaper about a resident of our town who was sent to jail for the theft of \$15.

I was quite surprised, in a way, but not really, considering I know a little of the boy's life in the past few years.

He was born in Normansville, and while growing up, he had little or no supervision and roamed the streets. When he was in school at Bethlehem Central he was slow in learning and did not progress rapidly. Consequently, when in Senior High, the lack of interest in school and the shortage of money at home, made it more feasible for the boy to quit school and go to work.

Basically this boy is intelligent, but not from reading books, because up to this day this boy cannot read or write and as one thing will lead to another, the boy could not find any decent job. So as a result he had to resign himself to working at low pay menial jobs.

What chance had this boy for a profitable future, not only for himself, but for the community around him?

Allegedly, in this theft, the boy used no violence, no guns, nor did he threaten anyone's life. He simply walked in the front door (using the key that the owner gave him because he was employed there) and took the money.

I am not deeming this boy innocent, but I do say this -when and if that boy serves his term; one to five years in jail - he and the community to which he returns will be worse off than they are now.

It is reported that the owner stated that the boy stole \$300 over a period of a few weeks. Then why didn!t the owner do something before now? The owner allegedly stated that he wasn't sure it was the bov. We can only say that since no force was used to enter, it could only have been someone with a key? Does this owner have a multitude of keys to his front door floating around? Why didn't he sit down with the boy and talk the thing out rather than have him arrested? Or is business so bad he must have a pound of flesh?

In a progressive community that we have here in the TriVillage I think we can all find the understanding that this boy needs. I think that this case should be one that justice is tempered with mercy.



Spotlight Editor and Readers: Note the similarity between the letter of "A Republican" in the March 15 Spotlight and the Old Guard campaign literature last fall -- purely a list of things claimed done; but no discussion of the many recommendations by The Lincolns on things undone or only partly done. They have been consistent in this -- mentioning only part-truths, part-accomplishments by a part-time supervisor-part-time police chiefpart-time Albany businessman. But Bethlehem residents deserve the whole truth.

Over 3,500 voters demonstrated their agreement with The Lincolns, so I cannot be sure which one is "A Lincoln," who wrote to the Spotlight earlier listing the things that still need doing in our town. However, he was not talking with tongue in cheek as "A Republican" would have us believe. The Old Guard cannot denv (and has never denied) that the items he listed are proposals whose adoption would benefit every resident. They need not

To the word "lethargy," describing incumbent town officials, I would add "lack of interest in the residents." Both terms apply to government or party leadership which . . .

- . . . pays so little attention to cost of government.
- . . . lets itself lag so far behind the thinking of the people.
- . . . hides its legal notices in a paper with minor circulation in the town.
- . . . inserts itself where it has no business (fire and school district elections).
- . . . has a supervisor whose TownHall day begins at 1 p. m.
- . . . ignores suggestions from those outside their clique.
- . . . refuses to make use of the terrific talents and experience of our residents by establishing non-paid advisory committees on matters worthy of investigation.

Mr. "A Republican" closes his letter by implying that the four Lincolns candidates were simply ambitious seekers of power. You overstepped your bounds on that one, Mr. "A Republican"! All 3,500 Lincolns voters cannot be wrong! The movement started by the four candidates (all of us Republicans) represented the first time in many years that a group of residents carefully analyzed our town and its government, realized how much was lack-







## 6,000 STUDENTS TO PARTICIPATE IN NEW FORM OF TEACHING WHICH WILL INCLUDE TWO-WAY RADIO

In addition to programmed instruction, large group instruction, team teaching, use of teacher aides and educational television, member schools of the Suburban Scholastic Conference, a group of schools located in the suburbs of Albany and Schenectady, New York, are experimenting with still a different method of instruction. This method goes beyond the walls of one building, it involves the students of all eight member schools simultaneously. This, in a true sense, is large group instruction since there will be approximately 6000 students participating. This will be made possible through the medium of the Two-Way F.M. Radio Conference.

This will be the second conference of this nature conducted by these schools. The first took place two years ago when Lt. Governor Malcolm Wilson spoke on the "Problems and Issues of the 1960 Legislative Season." Serving as a speaker for the coming conference on April 12 at 1 P.M. will be Mr. George Marotta of the Division of University Relations of the Peace Corps. His topic will be "Current Activities and Problems of the Peace Corps."

It is possible that a new dimension may be introduced to this conference by adding the video feature through the facilities of WMHT, the Mohawk Hudson Educational Television station located in Schenectady, New York. Whether or not this will be possible will depend upon the completion of the installation of this station's facilities. More definite information regarding this aspect of the conference will be forth coming by April 1.

Through the means of the Two-Way F.M. Radio Conference, students will be able to carry on two way communications with the speaker. As it is now planned, the speaker will make a twenty to twenty-five minute presentation. Following, this, schools will be called on in alphabetical order for questions. In most instances, these questions will be asked by a small panel of stu-

dents in each school through whom questions will be channeled from the student bodies. Mr. Marotta will be located either in the studio of F.M. station WMAC or Television station WHMT.

Dr. Virgil E. Tompkins, Co-ordinator of the Conference for the Suburban Council and also Principal of Bethlehem Central Senior High School, will serve as Moderator.

Although such conferences have been carried on for the past four or five years in Post-Graduate Medical Education by the Albany Medical College, this will be only the second time that this technique will have been used in public schools. Lending considerable assistance and guidance in conducting this conference will be Dr. Frank M. Woolsey, Jr., Associate Dean and Director of Post-Graduate Medical Education at Albany Medical College who pioneered in this type of instruction and Mr. Al Fredette, Station Manager for WAMC.
