BLANCHARD POST ANNOUNCES MEMORIAL DAY PARADE PLANS

Again this year Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post #1040, American Legion, will sponsor the Memorial Day Parade for the Tri-Village Area. Colonel Robert E. Mulligan, NYG, chairman of the parade committee, announced the details of the parade at a meeting of the division marshals at the Post Hall, last Monday night.

All participants are requested to be in their respective assembly areas by 9:30 A.M. on Wednesday, May 30. The parade will start promptly at 10 A.M. from the Post Hall. Route of march will be south on Elsmere Avenue to Kenwood Avenue, then west on Kenwood to Delaware Avenue, then east on Delaware Avenue to Servicemen's Memorial Park where the reviewing stand will be located.

A memorial service will be conducted in Servicemen's Memorial Park at the conclusion of the parade.

Grand Marshal of the parade will be Lt. Comdr. Whitman Daniels, USNR. His aides will be Lt. Col. James W. Marotta, USA, and Major Robert Roth, USAFR. They will be followed by a color guard provided by the U.S. Air Force Reserve and several cars carrying the Hon. Bertram E. Kohinke, Honorary Grand Marshal and Supervisor of the Town of Bethlehem, plus several other Town officials.

Division One will form on Poplar Drive beside the Post Hall. It will be composed of the members of Blanchard Post #1040, American Legion, and the Auxiliary, plus the Yankee Doodle Band. Division Marshal will be Post Commander Alexander J. Woehrle. His aides will be Vice-Commander Rodger Fryer and Lt. Col. Charles J. O'Hara, USAR.

Division Two will consist of Company "A", 1st Medium Tank Battalion, 210th Armored Regiment, NYARNG stationed in the New Scotland Avenue Armory, Albany. It will form

on Poplar Drive in rear of Division One. Division Marshal will be its company commander, Captain Francis G. Cullen.

Division Three will consist of Bethlehem Memorial Post #3185, Veterans of Foreign Wars and the Auxiliary. It will form on Herber Avenue tacing Elsmere Avenue. Division Marshal will be its new Post Commander, Ralph Sherman. His aides will be his new Vice-Commanders, Joseph Cozz and Joseph Grieco.

Division Four will form on Glendale Avenue. It will be composed of the Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Cub Scouts, Brownies and the 4-H Clubs. Music will be provided by the Bethlehem Central Junior-Senior High School Band. Division Marshal will be Colonel Lawrence McArthur, USAFR, and a Tri-Village Scouter. His aides will be Mrs. Fred Muchelot, a Delmar Girl Scout leader, and Mrs. John Zitko, a member of the 4-H Council.

Division Five will form on Ridge Road beside the Elsmere Fire House. It will consist of the following fire companies, auxiliaries and motorized equipment; Delmar, Elsmere, Slingerlands and Glenmont. Music will be provided by the Village Fire Fifers. The Cyprus Temple Motor Patrol will also be a part of this division. Division Marshal will be Elsmere Fire Chief Richard Smith. His aides will be Delmar Fire Chief Henry Kleinke and Slingerlands Fire Chief Robert Collins.

At the conclusion of the parade, Blanchard Post Commander Alexander J. Woehrle will conduct a memorial service for all American service men and women who have given their lives for our country. Invocation will be given by Rev. Charles H. Kaulfuss of St. Stephen's Episcopal Church, and Blanchard Post Chaplain. The Post will present a new American flag to Supervisor Bertram Kohinke to be

flown in Servicemen's Memorial Park during the ensuing year. There will be musical selections by the Yankee Doodle Band and the Village Fire Fifers. A floral tribute from the American Legion Auxiliary and the Veterans of Foreign Wars Auxiliary will be placed by the respective presidents of those organizations. After Three Volleys by the Post Firing Squad and Taps sounded by Boy Scout buglers, the service will be concluded with Benediction by the Rev. Paul G. Bondi of St. Thomas' Roman Catholic Church. Also taking part in the ceremony will be Rabbi Alvin S. Roth, Temple Beth Emeth.

Commander Woehrle hopes that all residents of the Tri-Village Area will display the flag of our country on Memorial Day. He is particularly anxious to have 100% participation along the route of march during the parade.

Correct flag etiquette on Memorial Day requires that the flag be hoisted to full-staff, then lowered to half-staff until noon, in honor of our heroic dead. At noon the flag is hoisted to full-staff, remaining there until it is lowered at sunset, in honor of our living heroes.

SHOCKER FILM TO BE SHOWN BY ROTARY

The Delmar Rotary Club, as a public service, has arranged, through the courtesy of the New York Telephone Co., to show the startling and serious film "Signal #30" to the general public Friday evening, June 1st at 7:30 P.M. in the Bethlehem Central Senior High School Auditorium,

Thirty minutes spent viewing this film is guaranteed to make you a more careful driver. Rotary members unanimously agreed, after seeing the film at a recent meeting, that every citizen should have the priviledge of being exposed to this unusual documentary showing the tragic consequences of poor driving judgment and faulty equipment.

It is requested, because of the nature of the film, that only people sixteen years of age and over attend.

The following is an endorsement by Charles Redmond, Chairman of the Safety Committee, Town of Bethlehem.

"Signal #30" film is put out by the Ohio State Police, and is a real 'shock film.' It should be pointed out to any audience to which this film is shown that this is not the answer to accident prevention. You must educate the public on the proper driv-

ing techniques; for example, driving defensively at all times, driving without excessive speed, etc."

The following is a statement made by Bertram E. Kohinke, Supervisor of the Town of Bethlehem:

"SAFETY IS EVERYBODY'S BUSINESS - The wise driver always exercises every measure of precaution even if he is delayed at an intersection giving another driver the right-of-way, or being patient in slow moving traffic. Safety signals, measures and speed limits should be obeyed at all times. It is needless to say that when we drive defensively, we are much safer drivers."







New Publication Started By Republican Organization

The Bethlehem Eagle, a newsletter published by the Bethlehem Republican Club, rolled off the presses recently and 1,000 copies of the first issue are in the mails addressed to town residents.

In addition to stories on the

record of the Republican town administration, the first issue takes a few potshots at the Albany County Democrat organization.

One story charges that Albany illegally carries "certain stateowned buildings . . . on the assessment rolls of the City of Albany." The taxes are not paid and the tax is then picked up by the entire county, the article contends, and that Bethlehem is chipping in to pay the illegal taxes. The buildings referred to are owned by the State Teachers Retirement Fund which, the Court of Appeals has ruled, may not be taxed by the city.

Other stories range from accounts of Supervisor Bertram E. Kohinke's recent attacks on the Democrat-controlled Board of Supervisors to a brief item describing the town's mosquitocontrol program.

The "Eagle" is edited by Town Republican Club members who contribute the news items. The club hopes to publish an issue each month.
