All bicycles should be licensed. License can only be purchased at Town Clerk's Office in Town Hall, Delmar, New York.

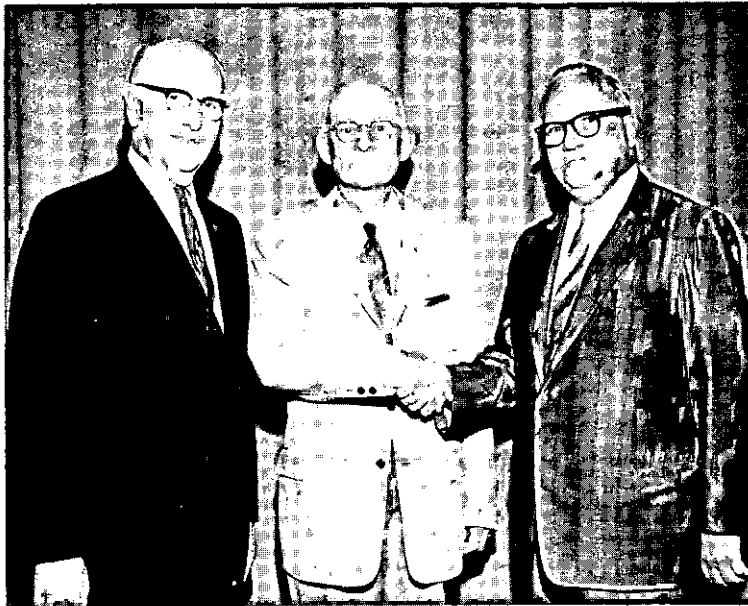

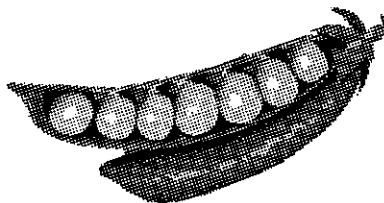

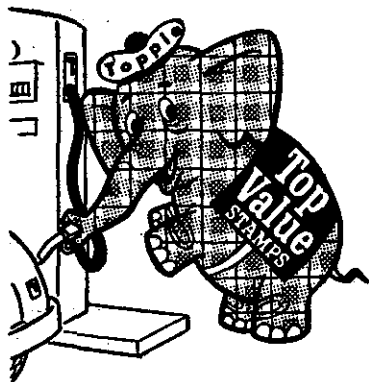

New Industrial Zones Set

The Town of Bethlehem has nine new industrial zones.

Following a public hearing on the nine industrial areas, the Bethlehem Town Planning Board unanimously approved measures setting aside six of the areas for heavy industry and three for light industrial use.

Areas zoned for heavy industrial use include:

Along the Hudson River from the Port of Albany to the Van Wies Point residential section to Route 144. Much of this area is now used for industrial purposes. Niagara Mohawk

Power Corporation's power plant, the town's largest industry, is there.

The Murray-Simon site, bounded by the New York Central Railroad tracks, the New York State Thruway and the Thruway's Berkshire Spur.

Four areas near the Selkirk yards of the New York Central Railroad. Two are along Route 32; another is southwest of the railroad yards on either side of Bells Crossing Road and the fourth straddles the railroad tracks between Route 32 and 9W.

The three light industrial areas are in the general vicinity.
