Lou Ismay of the Rensselaer County Junior Museum will take a group of adventurous boys and girls on expeditions through the Mohawk-Hudson Valley, exploring the historical, industrial and archeological highlights of the area.

Richard and David Woods of RPI will teach two classes (Jr. -Sr. high level and elementary level) on Space and Weather, beginning with what can be seen through a telescope and progressing through what will be happening in space exploration for the next dozen years, the problems to be faced, etc. Weather, in its interrelationship to space will be included, with the opportunity for students





## MILL HILL MISSIONARIES ORDINATION ON JULY 7


The ordination of the first three Mill Hill Missionaries in America will take place on Saturday morning, July 7, at the Cathedral of the Immaculate Conception, Albany at 9 A.M. The Most Reverend William A. Scully, Bishop of Albany, will officiate.

The three young men are Carl Cooper of Chicago, Lester Lonergan of Yonkers, N.Y. and Daniel Callinan of Minn. These three Mill Hill boys were among the first students who graduated from Mater Christi College in Albany. Their philosophical course was pursued at St. Louis University and their theological studies were taken at Mill Hill's Motherhouse in England.

The story of Mill Hill dates back to 1866 when Herbert Cardinal Vaughan founded the first English-speaking Society for foreign missions at Mill Hill, London with only one student and himself.

Bishop Gibbons of Albany is truly a living link with Cardinal Vaughan. When the Bishop was studying theology in 1893 at the American College in Rome, he was much impressed by an address given by Cardinal Vaughan to the theology students. The Cardinal begged them to remember the vital needs of the foreign missions.

In 1948, when Mill Hill sought admittance into the Albany Diocest, Bishop Gibbons not only welcomed them but he also helped establish their first foundation. was a 14-room Colonial house on the country estate of Dr. H.L.K. Shaw - a one-time pediatrician in State Farm Road, Guilderland. Since the official opening in 1951, expansion has been a must. New offices, an auditorium and living quarters have been added by the Brothers to the original building. At present a large chapel is being constructed and is near completion. A farm, on the opposite side of State Farm Road, has also become part of the Mill Hill property. It, too, is being operated by the Brothers, who plan to build their Training Center on it - a Center where Mill Hill Brothers will be trained as builders.

LEGAL STATUS OF WOMEN IN NEW YORK STATE

There are many laws in New York State that protect the rights and well-being of working women, according to Secretary of State Caroline K. Simon. Possibly the most important legislation of all is Section 199A of the Labor Law which states that no employee shall, because of sex, be subjected to any discrimination in rate of pay. Especially significant in New York State, is a law providing that a married woman can now enjoy the same legal status as an unmarried woman in entering into contracts - which is equal to that of men.

## Natural Gas for Voorheesville

The Public Service Commission today authorized Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation to construct a new natural gas distribution system within the Village of Voorheesville, Al-

bany County, and to exercise a gas franchise granted it recently by that municipality.

The company now provides natural gas service within the Town of Guilderland, which is north of the Town of New Scotland in which Voorheesville is located. To provide service in Voorheesville it proposes to extend its mains from their present terminus in Guilderland southerly. This will require about 24,890 feet of new eight-inch main and 2,000 feet of four-inch main, together with necessary service laterals.

Work is scheduled to be started immediately so that service may begin before the start of the nextheating season. All construction is to be done in conformity with the P.S.C. Gas Safety Code.
