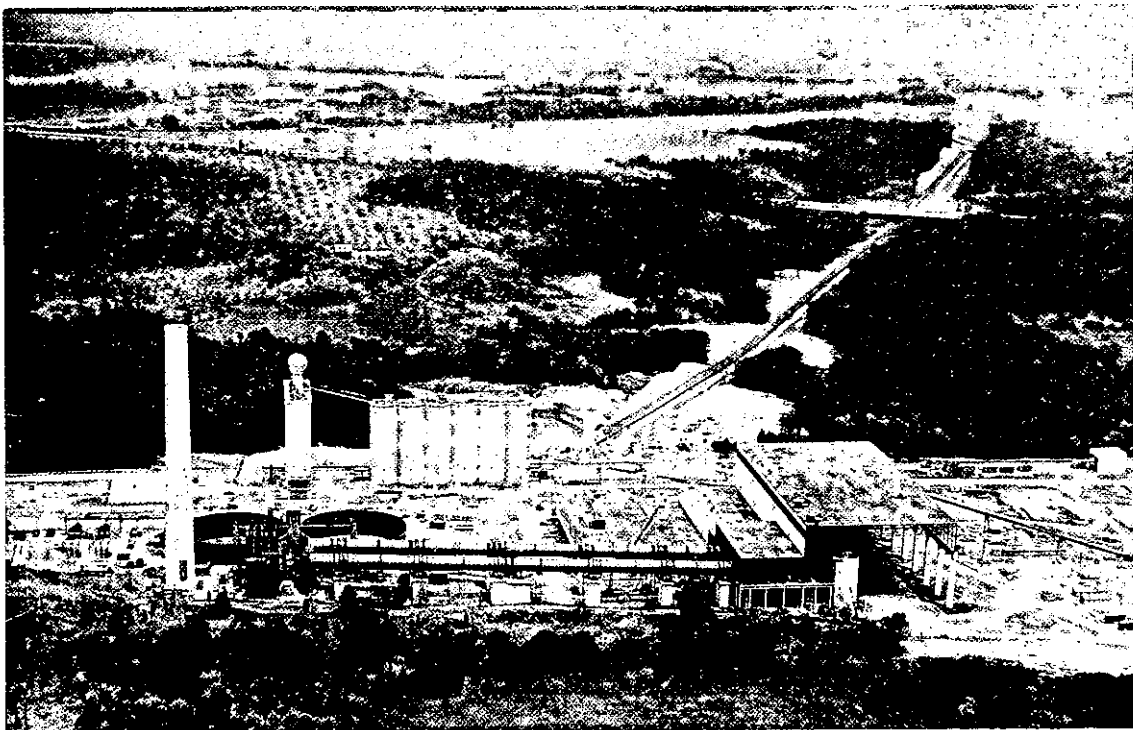

An aerial view of the Atlantic Cement Company plant under construction at Ravena (south of Albany) portrays the size and scope of the project - the largest cement plant ever to be built at one time. The \$64 million plant will have an annual capacity of 10 million barrels of cement per year. Leading from the storage silos (center) is an 8,000 foot conveyor with a capacity of 1,000 tons per hour, leading directly to the company's dock on the Hudson River. The Ravena plant, with direct water access to the Atlantic seacoast through the Hudson River, will service ten major terminals from New England to the Gulf Coast.

Several key positions in the Atlantic Cement Plant have already been filled in anticipation of that time when operation will begin.

Local men chosen for these executive jobs are: Karl Hauser, Delmar, plant superintendent; Lou Spellman, Delmar, technical director; William Hutchins, Delmar, purchasing agent; James Perkins, Ravena, quarry superintendent; Robert Schlardeale, Delmar, maintenance superintendent; Laurie Davie, Ravena, supervisor of industrial relations; Frank With, South Bethlehem, office manager.

If the 1961 season was any criterion, the best post positions during the 24-day Saratoga racing season, July 30 through August 25, will be No. 2 and No. 3. There were 31 winners from each last year.

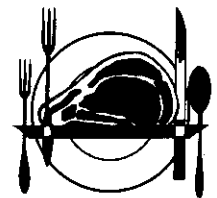

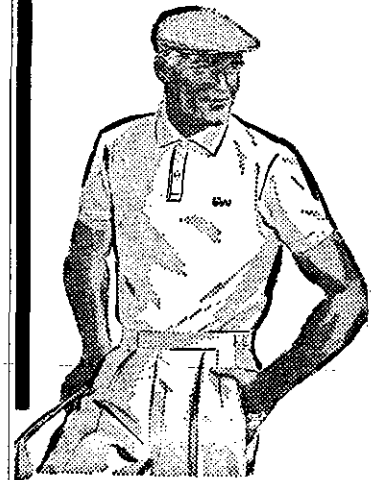

EUCLID AVENUE RESIDENTS OUT TO SQUASH CAR WASH

A group of Euclid Avenue area residents in Elsmere have filed a protest with the Appeals Board of the Town of Bethlehem and have requested a hearing to publicly oppose the erection of a car wash in back of the Shell Gas station at the corner of Euclid and Delaware Avenues. The car wash would face residential Euclid Avenue. Cars would enter the car wash building via Delaware Avenue and exit on Euclid Avenue, a narrow town street.

The group's action has brought increasing expressions of interest and growing concern from many residents of Bethlehem's residential streets which intersect Delaware Avenue. A spokesman for the group points out that the possibility of encroachment on other residential streets by commercial enterprises is evident and alarming.

A grave concern to the committee is the traffic and safety problems attendant upon such an operation at this location, particularly the increase in hazard to the many children who would have to contend with the flow of washed cars exiting across the sidewalk on Euclid Avenue.

The Action Committee includes Martin Barr, Mrs. Richard Davis, Carl Gordon, Harold Manroe, Mrs. Milhelm Moe, Professor Albert Mossin, Martin Ogden, Frank O'Dell, Lawrence Pauley, and Mr. and Mrs. Don-

ald Slingerland, with Mr. Harry O'Brien as chairman.

In addition to the appeal to the Zoning Board, the residents in the real estate subdivision, which includes the property on which the car wash is proposed to be built, have brought an action in Supreme Court to prohibit the construction of the car wash on the ground that covenants in the deeds prohibit use of the property for business purposes.

SARATOGA GETS SET FOR BIGGER AND BETTER SEASON

Saratoga's 24-day Thoroughbred race meeting opened on Monday, July 30, and this year, The New York Racing Association will present added opportunities for two-year-olds on a well-balanced stakes schedule of 18 races.

This year's stakes program lists one more event than last year, and the added money offered by the Association comes to \$565,000, or \$40,000 more than in 1961.

Two \$75,000 added races headline the stakes program - the 93rd running of the Travers for 3-year-olds on August 18, and the 58th running of the Hopeful, for 2-year-olds on closing day, August 25. The Travers is the oldest stakes race in the country, being antedated on the North American continent only by the Queen's Plate in Canada.

There are two additional stakes races for 2-year-olds this year, one open to both sexes

and one limited to fillies. The Sanford, run last year for the first time as a handicap for older horses on the turf, returns to its spot as a test for juveniles. As the third of four races in the New York Series for two-year-olds, the Sanford will be run at five and a half furlongs on August 6.

The Adirondack, for 2-year-old fillies, returns to the program for the first time since 1955. At six furlongs, it will be run on August 15. These two races bring to four the races open to all 2-year-olds and to three those limited to juvenile fillies.

To replace the Sanford as a turf course handicap, the NYRA has programed the first running of the Seneca Handicap at one mile and five furlongs on August 24. One other turf course stake is listed, the Bernard Baruch Handicap at one mile and one sixteenth on August 8.

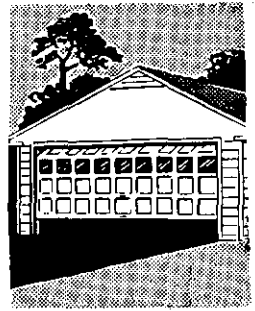

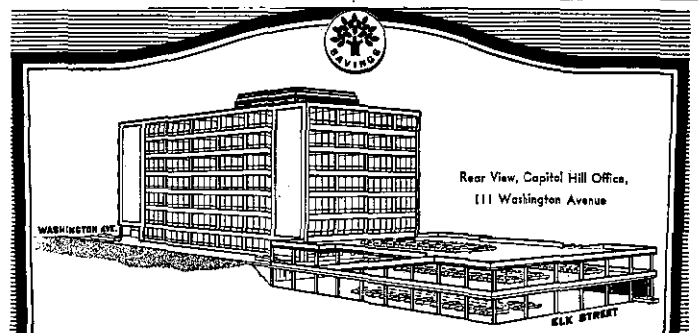
