

## FUROR OVER CAR WASH RAGES ON AND ON - 2 OPPOSING STATEMENTS AND A LETTER

### Statement No. 1

A large turn-out is expected at Town Hall next Wednesday evening, August 29, at eight o'clock, when the Board of Appeals hears the protests of local homeowners against the granting of a permit for the construction of an automatic car wash in back of the Shell gas station at the corner of Delaware and Euclid Avenues. Entrance to the car wash would be on Delaware Avenue. Washed cars would exit into Euclid Avenue at a point approximately 160 feet from Delaware Avenue.

The homeowners contend that the permit was unlawfully issued and that the car wash would not only seriously undermine residential property values on Euclid Avenue, but would also cause hazardous traffic tie-ups on Delaware Avenue and would create other problems involving safety and general welfare in the Town.

Spokesmen for Fleahman-Rice Enterprises, Inc., proposed operator of the car wash, have claimed that the car wash would provide employment for residents of the area and would bring additional income to town merchants.

### Statement No. 2

Arthur L. Fleahman, Jr. and Robert H. Rice, of Delmar, N.Y. owners and operators of the proposed car wash on the corner of Delaware and Euclid Avenues in Elsmere, N.Y. claim overwhelming support

from the residents of the Town of Bethlehem.

The building will face and be visible from Delaware Avenue, will have a large entranceway from that street and will be located within the area zoned for business. This entranceway will accommodate a minimum of forty cars at a time, if necessary, in order to eliminate any traffic tie-up on Delaware Avenue. Only the exit will be on Euclid Avenue and will assure dispersal of one car at a time back on to Delaware Avenue.

There will be absolutely no parking of cars on Euclid Avenue in connection with the car wash operation. The Shell station, also located on the same corner, is planned to be operated in conjunction with the car wash.

Much time was spent, previous to planning the building, in sampling the opinion of town residents, and the vast majority of those questioned expressed their enthusiastic support of the venture, which will provide a much needed service and convenience in this area.

Thousands of residents are urging immediate completion of the project in order to expedite this convenience. This new enterprise will provide 25 to 30 jobs for the residents of the area and will bring additional income to other merchants in the Town of Bethlehem.

### The Letter

Dear Sir:

Establishing an automatic car wash behind the gas station at Delaware and Euclid seemed such a good idea to me that I was shocked by the heated opposition of a small but vocal group of "neighbors." So I went to the intended proprietors to ask the facts.

I discovered:

- (1) The car wash entrance will be on Delaware Avenue, and there will be room for 40 cars, if necessary, to wait in line off the street. Washed cars will exit, one at a time, on Euclid Avenue, 150 feet from the corner.

Vincent C. Gazzetta, a resident of the eighth election district is seeking election to one of the posts now held by two appointees.

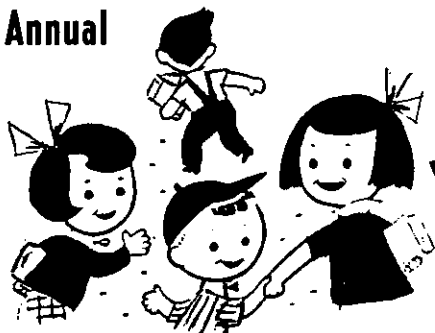
Mr. Gazzetta, actively campaigning for the post, has indicated a concern over the fact that prior to this contest the committeemen did not make themselves known to the residents of the district.

- (2) Town zoning regulations for this location permit commercial use of the land for a depth of 225 feet from the center of Delaware Avenue.
- (3) The car wash will be built on the same plot occupied by the gas station, a fact which would appear to make any 50-year-old deed restrictions legally anachronistic.
- (4) Delaware Avenue, as anyone can see, is solid with commercial property from the Four Corners to the Norman's Kill viaduct.

The opposing group has some very fine people in it, but I'm afraid they're guilty of trying to perpetuate the past. Trying to keep Delmar a strictly "bedroom community" doesn't face the fact that residence properties alone cannot pay in taxes for the town services and the schools most of us want. willing to do. The apartment house project was blocked, but today office buildings, a bank, and bowling lanes occupy the space. The lesson is that forcibly stopping the clock of enterprise eventually gives it a spring-wound boost.

I think an automatic car wash would provide a welcome service to Tri-Village car owners, would add tax money to the public till, and would not work a hardship of any kind on nearby residential property owners.

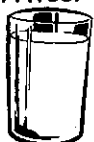

**ENLARGED JUNIOR COLLEGE ANNOUNCES PROGRAM**

The Junior College of Albany is looking forward to the best year of its life this fall with more classrooms and faculty than a year ago, three new programs available for its students and a chapter of Phi Theta Kappa (the national junior college scholastic honor society) established on its campus.

Dean W. Robert Holmes announced the appointment of two new members to the staff. Dr. Arthur Lennig, Ph.D., University of Wisconsin, will teach English and Mrs. Jeanette Lafayette, who has just completed a double M.A. at the State University College of Education, Albany, will teach French, Dr. Lennig, who comes from Albany, earned both his B.A. and M.A. at the State University College here before going to Wisconsin. He and his wife have spent the summer in Europe. Mrs. Lafayette entered the field of education after several years experience in personnel and public relations. At the College of Education she was a graduate

assistant in television teaching.

The junior college's physical facilities continue to improve. The campus whose beauty has already caused favorable comment has been further landscaped and the parking facilities improved. Dean Holmes and his family have moved across the campus and the building in which they lived last year is being remodeled.

The new programs available at the Junior College are pre-physical therapy, pre-medical therapy and pre-law, which permit a student while living at home to do the first two years of college work toward a career in these fields. In addition to the new programs, the Junior College offers four other programs, two of which are designed for those men and women who plan to transfer their credits to a four-year college. The two programs designed for transfer purposes are the liberal arts program leading to an associate in arts degree and the business administration program leading to an associate in applied science degree.

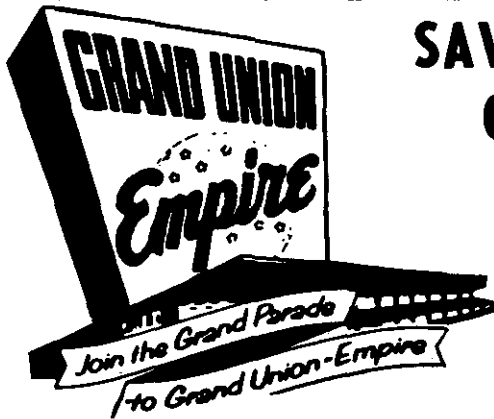



**Academy For Girls Adds Land**

New vistas in teaching have been opened with the purchase of additional land by the Albany Academy for Girls. The property, recently required, adjoins the present thirteen acre site on Academy Road in Albany and runs to Hackett Blvd. The already fine program of outdoor sports which includes field hockey, lacrosse, tennis, and softball, will be increased. A new playground for the lower school is being developed. In addition, the faculty and members of the planning committee of the Board of Trustees are most excited about the creation of a botanical garden which will enable study of animal and plant life.

Dr. George R. Cooley, resident of Albany and Rensselaerville, and a research fellow of Harvard University, is working with the committee and the science department of the Academy for Girls in developing the land as an ecological laboratory. Recently Dr. Cooley received a letter from Mr. Archibald Shorey, also of Albany, who has also volunteered to help the school. Mr. Shorey is an enthusiastic naturalist. Since his retirement from the New York State Conservation department, he has worked with young people, particularly the Boy Scouts, in nature study. Mr. Shorey told of a telephone call from one of his young Scout friends who had spotted two unusual birds on a small pond on the Academy for Girls property at the rear of the

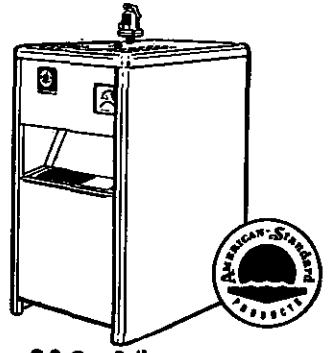

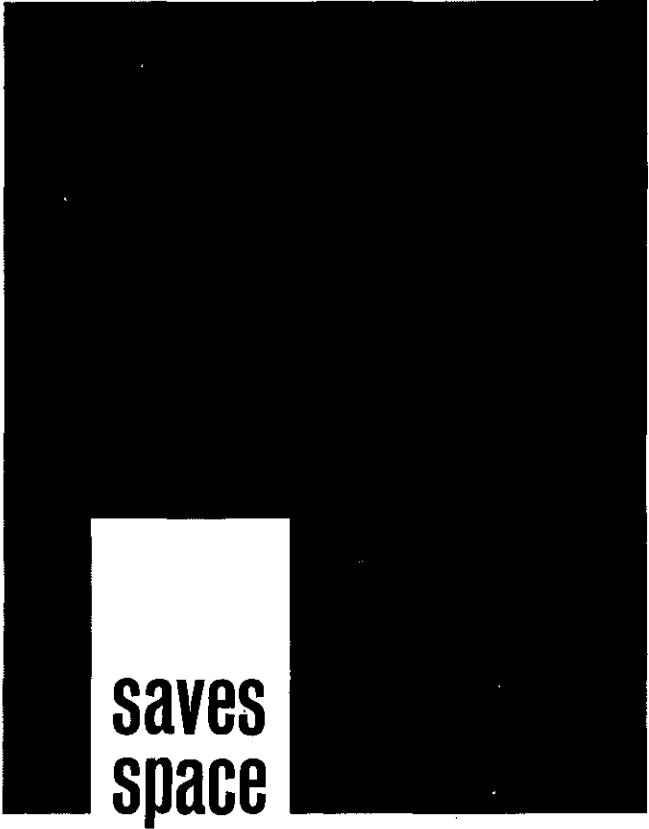

training geared to immediate job usefulness and lifetime placement service, lists its most recent graduates as being employed in such diversified agencies as office employees with the State Police and Civil Service to independent insurance and banking companies, schools and hospitals.

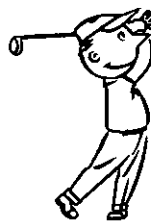

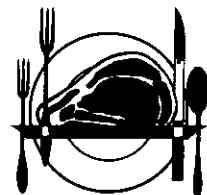

## SECTION

### R-C-S TO OPEN NEW JUNIOR-SENIOR HIGH SEPT. 6

A milestone will be reached in the communities of the R.C.S. School district when the doors of the new junior-senior high school swing open this fall. This will mark the opening of the first physical facility in the district since the Feura Bush, Jericho, Selkirk and South Bethlehem buildings and the Coeymans additions were erected in the 1928-30 period. Moreover, it will be the first time in 4 years that the high school students will not be attending school on double sessions. With the opening of this school, it will mean they will have available for use, new laboratory facilities and equipment, new shops, art rooms, and home economic rooms, a 750 seat auditorium with stage and controlled lighting, a new modern kitchen equipped with the latest appliances and a dining room which

will seat 350 students; there will also be music rooms, an attractive library, a large gym and adequate classroom space.

With these added facilities it will be possible to offer a broader and more flexible program. It will also mean that a full blown extra curricular program can be introduced and students will have time in school for study purposes where reference materials are readily at hand and teachers will be available to lend assistance.

#### Orientation to Building

On September 6, the first day of school, students will be introduced and oriented to the building. On this day a special schedule will be followed. Seventh and eighth grades will report at 8:00 a.m., the regular morning reporting time, and will go directly to the auditorium. There a brief orientation meeting will be held and di-

rections will be given for the remainder of the morning. An abbreviated class schedule will be followed for the remainder of the morning and students will be dismissed to go home at 11:57. At 11:45, ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth graders will report to school and go directly to the auditorium and from there on they will follow a schedule similar to the one described for grades

7 and 8. Dismissal time for these people will be 3:57. No lunch will be served in the cafeteria this first day.

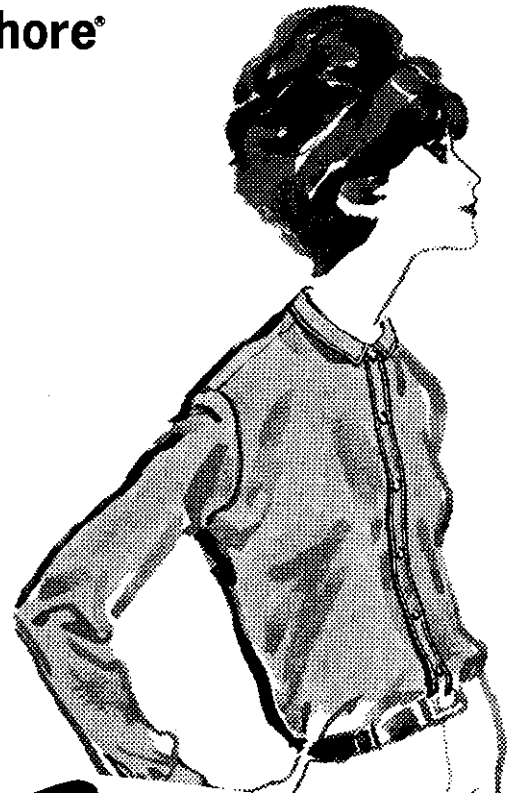

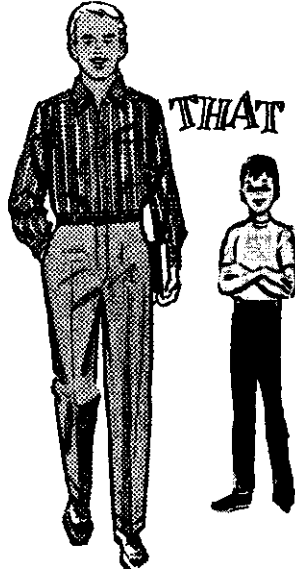

Automobiles Not Permitted

At a recent meeting of the Board of Education a resolution was passed prohibiting students except those involved in the school's cooperative work-experience program from driving cars or other vehicles to school during the day. The work-experience students will be permitted to drive only when a private car is needed to transport them to their place of work. The high school principal will issue permits in instances where this is necessary.

No Smoking

As a result of other action taken by the Board of Educa-

tion, students will not be permitted to smoke on the school grounds during the day. At evening functions they may do so in areas designated for this purpose.

Adult Education

With the facilities offered in the new junior-senior high school, it is hoped that an expanded adult education program can be offered this year. Final phases have not as yet been made in this respect however. An announcement relative to the date classes will begin and the courses to be offered will be made the latter part of September or early October. Mr. Harry Sturges, department head for the industrial arts department, will again serve as director of the program.
