FUROR OVER CAR WASH RAGES ON AND ON-2 OPPOSING STATEMENTS AND A LETTER

Statement No. 1

A large turn-out is expected at Town Hall next Wednesday evening, August 29, at eight o'clock, when the Board of Appeals hears the protests of local homeowners against the granting of a permit for the construction of an automatic car wash in back of the Shell gas station at the corner of Delaware and Euclid Avenues. Entrance to the car wash would be on Delaware Avenue. Washed cars would exit into Euclid Avenue at a point approximately 160 feet from Delaware Avenue.

The homeowners contend that the permit was unlawfully issued and that the car wash would not only seriously undermine residential property values on Euclid Avenue, but would also cause hazardous traffic tieups on Delaware Avenue and would create other problems involving safety and general welfare in the Town.

Spokesmen for Fleahman-Rice Enterprises, Inc., proposed operator of the car wash, have claimed that the car wash would provide employment for residents of the area and would bring additional income to town merchants.

Statement No. 2

Arthur L. Fleahman, Jr. and Robert H. Rice, of Delmar, N.Y. owners and operators of the proposed car wash on the comer of Delaware and Euclid Avenues in Elsmere, N.Y. claim overwhelming support from the residents of the Town of Bethlehem.

The building will face and be visible from Delaware Avernue, will have a large entranceway from that street and will be located within the area zoned for business. This entranceway will accommodate a minimum of forty cars at a time, if necessary, in order to eliminate any traffic tie-up on Delaware Avenue. Only the exit will be on Euclid Avenue and will assure dispersal of one car at a time back on to Delaware Avenue.

There will be absolutely no parking of cars on Euclid Avenue in connection with the car wash operation. The Shell station, also located on the same corner, is planned to be operated in conjunction with the car wash.

Much time was spent, previous to planning the building, in sampling the opinion of town residents, and the vast majority of those questioned expressed their enthusiastic support of the venture, which will provide a much needed service and convenience in this area.

Thousands of residents are urging immediate completion of the project in order to expedite this convenience. This new enterprise will provide 25 to 30 jobs for the residents of the area and will bring additional income to other merchants in the Town of Bethlehem.

The Letter

Dear Sir:

Establishing an automatic car wash behind the gas station at Delaware and Euclid seemed such a good idea to me that I was shocked by the heated opposition of a small but vocal group of "neighbors." So I went to the intended proprietors to ask the facts.

I discovered:

(1) The car wash entrance will be on Delaware Avenue, and there will be room for 40 cars, if necessary, to wait in line off the street. Washed cars will exit, one at a time, on Euclid Avenue, 150 feet from the corner.

Academy For Girls Adds Land

Since his retirement from the New York State Conservation department, he has worked with young people, particularly the Boy Scouts, in nature study. Mr. Shorey told of a telephone call from one of his young Scout friends who had spotted two unusual birds on a small pond on the Academy for Girls property at the rear of the







R-C-S TO OPEN NEW JUNIOR-SENIOR HIGH SEPT. 6

A milestone will be reached in the communities of the R.C.S. School district when the doors of the new juniorsenior high school swing open this fall. This will mark the opening of the first physical facility in the district since the Feura Bush, Jericho, Selkirk and South Bethlehem buildings and the Coeymans addition were erected in the 1928-30 period. Moreover, it will be the first time in 4 years that the high school students will not be attending school on double sessions. With the opening of this school, it will mean they will have available for use, new laboratory facilities and equipment, new shops, art rooms, and home economic rooms, a 750 seat auditorium with stage and controlled lighting, a new modern kitchen equipped with the latest appli-

will seat 350 students; there will also be music rooms, an attractive library, a large gym and adequate classroom space.

With these added facilities it will be possible to offer a broader and more flexible program. It will also mean that a full blown extra curricular program can be introduced and students will have time in school for study purposes where reference materials are readily at hand and teachers will be available to lend assistance.

On September 6, the first day of school, students will be introduced and oriented to the building. On this day a special schedule will be followed. Seventh and eighth grades will report at 8:00 a.m., the regular morning reporting time, and will go directly to the auditorium. There a brief orientation meeting will be held and di-

rections will be given for the remainder of the morning. An abbreviated class schedule will be followed for the remainder of the morning and students will be dismissed to go home at 11:57. At 11:45, ninth, tenth, eleventh and twelfth graders will report to school and go directly to the auditorium and from there on they will follow a schedule similar to the one described for grades

7 and 8. Dismissal time for these people will be 3:57. No lunch will be served in the cafeteria this first day.





No Smoking


