### BETHLEHEM GOP REVEALS PLANS FOR ELECTION - NOVEMBER 6

Otto de Heus, president of the Town of Bethlehem Republican Organization, recently revealed plans for the November elections. He said, "I received a letter from Governor Rockefeller Oct. 3, 1962, in which he wrote:

Dear Mr. de Heus:

Please convey my very cordial greetings to all members of the Town of Bethlehem Republican organization and my hearty appreciation of their zealous, effective and well directed work in behalf of our party.

It is most encouraging to recall that in 1958 Bethlehem turned out 85 per cent of the eligible voters with 7,413 votes for the Republican ticket as against 1,537 for the opposition. I am truly delighted to learn that your objective is to have at least 90 percent of the voters go to the polls in November.

"The letter certainly indicates that the G.O.P., even on a state level, has confidence that our town organization will produce the vote this fall. We have always had a fine voting record and I am confident that with the help of the 300 Block Captains we now have and the devoted committeemen. we set

a new record," said Mr. de Heus.

"It is planned that each and every voter will be personally contacted by one of our workers, " Mr. de Heus said. "This election is part of our program started last year of maintaining communication between the people and the government. Our efforts are a 'one shot affair' but a continuous yearround job of keeping in contact with the people. We think that the voters in our town want constant communication with the government - not just a brief solicitation at election time. This he is entitled to and this he is going to get.

"Several weeks ago we offered our help to Ned Conway, County G.O.P. Chairman. We will be on call to help man the polls or perform any other job in Albany or anywhere else he sees fit. I might add that several of the other towns in Albany County are sending volunteer workers to Albany. We are in accord with Mr. Conway's election plans and feel assured that the forthcoming campaign will be successful."



### RE-DEDICATION OF MEMORIAL PARK SUNDAY, NOV. 11

In the year 1942, just after Pearl Harbor, patriotic fervor was at its height. Young men and women in every walk of life were leaving homes to enter into the service of the United States Army, Navy, Air Corps and Marine Corps. Seventeen hundred young residents of the Town of Bethlehem entered into the service.

It was at that time that three men of the area were formed into a Veterans! Committee to consider the construction of a Memorial Park or some tribute to those people who had gone into active service. The Committee was composed of Dr. Thomas M. Holmes, Otto D. deHeus, and John M. Oliver.

This group approached Mr. Arthur M. Main, President of Main Bros. Oil Co., Inc., who owned some property at the junction of Delmar and Elsmere. He very graciously permitted the Committee to use this land at no cost to the Committee, wanting to do his part to pay tribute to these people who entered into service.

A park was designed and built under the supervision of the Committee; many shrubs and trees were planted; top soil brought in; and a Memorial Plaque was erected. The designer and builder of the Plaque was Walter J. Hotaling, who, as a patriotic citizen, built it at no charge.

Dr. Holmes and John M. Oliver have passed away. Dr. Holmes served in the British Army as a surgeon at the outbreak of the War, and transferred to the American Army when America entered the conflict in 1917. Mr. deHeus and Mr. Oliver also served in World War I, with the American Expeditionary Forces in France.


Conscious of the mortality of man, Mr. Main now plans to deed this property to the Town for perpetual use as a Memorial Park. Plans are under way for a re-dedication of this Memorial Park on Sunday, November 11, 1962, at 2:00 P.M. This is the old Armistice Day, which is now called Veterans' Day. 



107 developing countries in their fight against the dread diseases which affect millions of children, in their struggle to provide adequate nutrition for their growing youngsters, and in their efforts to replace superstition and ignorance with sound maternal and child health practices. This was selfhelp, for the aided governments more than matched every dollar of UNICEF aid, and the programs were, as always, designed to become a lasting and permanent part of the aided countries1 economies. In our community we raised \$776.80 for the UNICEF Program - a commendable amount which we hope to exceed in 1962.

The local committee is planning their program now which will include three distribution and collection centers. Parents are being asked to bring the small children - grades 1-6 to the Delmar Methodist Church at 3:30 P.M. where they may receive UNICEF containers and identification tags for each child. They should return at 7 P.M. for their Hallowe'en Party. There will also be Children's Programs in Slingerlands Community Methodist Church and at the Glenmont Community Church (Reformed).
