

OVERWHELMING ROCKEFELLER VOTE WHAT deHEUS PREDICTED

Re-Dedication Ceremonies Set for Sunday

The program for the rededication of Veterans Memorial Park has been announced by Otto deHeus, sole survivor of the original committee which founded this landmark at the junction of Delmar and Elsmere on Delaware Avenue. Dr. Thomas Holmes and John M. Oliver, both World War I veterans, are deceased. The Park, originally dedicated November 22, 1942, has been used for a parade termination point and for Memorial Day services by the American Legion and Veterans of Foreign Wars. The land on which the park is situated is owned by Arthur M. Main, prominent Delmar oil dealer, who said, "If it were not for the veterans, both living and those who made the supreme sacrifice, we might at this very moment be the slaves of an intolerable government. I feel humble and happy that the perpetuity of this park is

guaranteed by deeding this property to the Town of Bethlehem as a memorial to the veterans of the past, present, and future." The rededication ceremony, which takes place at the park November 11, 1962 at 2 P.M., will be identical to the original dedication and all those who Otto deHeus, President of the Republican party in the Town of Bethlehem, lived up to his prediction that Gov. "Now our Empire State will continue to go forward to greater successes and progress under Governor Rockefeller's leadership, "he added.



Annual Card Party Set at Girls' Academy


