# Candlelighting Service Set For Christmas Eve

A Christmas Eve Candlelighting Service will be held in the Delmar Presbyterian Church Monday, December 24, at 8 p.m. The service is particularly designed for family worship with children. Dear Editor,

I wonder how many residents of the Elsmere Fire District know that on Tuesday, December 4, they voted for (or failed to vote against) spending \$100,000.

It is my understanding that one of the fire engines is to be traded in for a new one at a cost of \$25,000, and that an addition is to be put on the fire house large enough to house the three fire engines. This leaves the existing fire house (two stories plus basement) to be remodeled to include private offices for the Commissioner and the Chief and other rooms to be used for meetings and who knows what. This addition and remodeling is to cost \$75,000.

I can see how a new fire engine could possibly increase the company's fire fighting effectiveness, but I can't see offhand how additional offices will do so. However, I admit that I am grossly uninformed on this subject, as was the

obvious desire of those promoting this expenditure.

The first I learned of this proposal was from a small article appearing in the Knickerbocker News on Monday, December 3 (the night before the balloting).

Upon appearing at the fire house to cast my ballot, I learned how well the voters of this district had been informed of the proposed expenditure. Notice was given in the Legal Notice column of the Knickerbocker News on November 20. I don't know how many people read the Legal Notices everyday in the newspaper, but it is not an easy task without the aid of a magnifying glass. In addition, notices were placed at five conspicuous (?) locations throughout the district. The four locations that I can recall were: (1) Quinn's Service Station, (2) The Coffee Shop, (3) the corner of Mason Road and some other street which I have forgotten and (4) the fire house.

Now perhaps I am in the minority because I don't carefully scrutinize the Legal Notices every night, don't trade at Quinn's Service Station, don't partake of coffee at the Coffee Shop, don't live on Mason Road and am not a fireman; but I doubt it. I am sure a few more conspicuous

spots, such as the supermarkets | or churches or the Plaza could have been utilized. In addition, an article in the Spotlight would have reached most of the people in the district.

It has been proven in the past that the voters of this town will not hesitate to endorse an expenditure which is proven to them to be necessary for the maintenance or betterment of a community service Perhaps this expenditure falls in that category. If this is true, it should have been factually presented to the people and their endorsement sought, rather than cloaked in a mantle of secrecy so that no opposition would be aroused.

I hope that the Fire Commissioner and Chief enjoy and make efficient use of their \$75,000 private offices and "meeting" rooms obtained by the "overwhelming" vote of

themselves and their friends.
