The rink has been carefully prepared by Henry Voorhees and other Legionnaires, and excellent skating has prevailed on many days of the winter thus far.

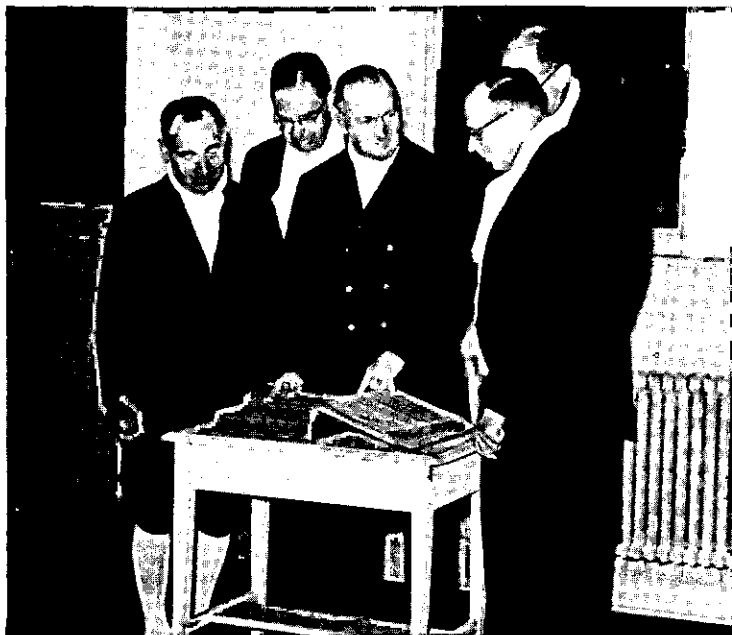
Church Women Elect

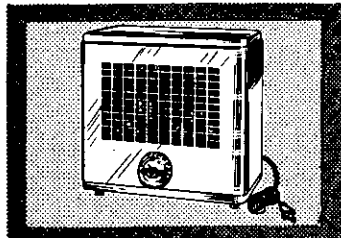

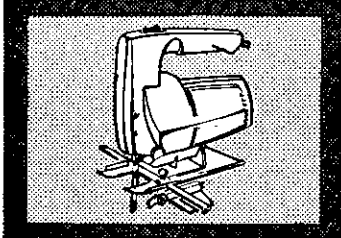

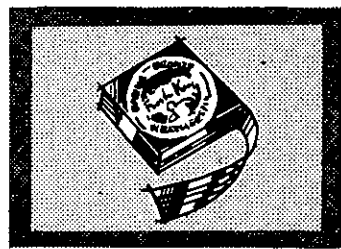

Dr. Arthur W. Pense to Retire on February 6

Dr. Arthur W. Pense of Delmar, Assistant Commissioner of Mental Hygiene since April 1, 1944, will retire February 6, it was announced today by

State Commissioner of Mental Hygiene, Dr. Paul H. Hoch.

Dr. Pense, 63, is in charge of the state's Office of Mental Retardation which coordinates all mental hygiene programs for the retarded.

Dr. Pense is widely recognized as an outstanding administrator in the mental retardation field and has received several awards from retardation groups in New York State. In

recent years, he has spurred the development of local services for the retarded under the state's community mental health program. He is the author of a number of papers on mental retardation.

Commissioner Hoch, in announcing Dr. Pense's retirement, praised him for his more than 36 years of "outstanding service" to the people of New York State.

"Few people in state government have given such whole-hearted and unstinting devotion to their duties as has been given by Dr. Pense," he said. "His services as an administrator and a leader, especially in the field of mental retardation, have been invaluable."

Dr. Pense is married to the former May Beatrice Wiggins of Brooklyn. They have three children. He resides with his wife at 42 Herrick Avenue, Delmar, N.Y.

Dr. Hoch said that Dr. Pense will be available for consultation to the department on mental retardation matters.

Mrs. Anders is a member of the Women's Republican Club of Bethlehem, and a member of the Glenmont Community Church of Glenmont.

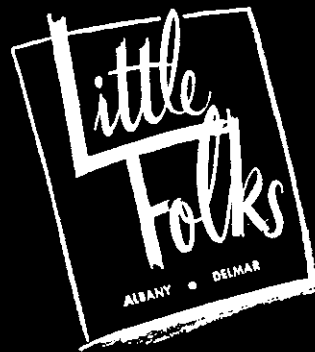
Music Group to Meet

Opportunity for Growth Holds First Annual Meeting

Opportunity for Growth, Inc. the Bethlehem Chamber of Commerce's industrial development corporation, held its first annual meeting on January 9 at the Senior High School.

At the meeting Richard Barzin, corporation president, announced the election of Howard W. Geyer and Edward C. Jenik, Jr. to the board of directors for three-year terms. Mr. Geyer, a local architect with Donald J. Stephens Associates, has been active since the corporation's inception and has extensive experience in development projects. Mr. Jenik is a project engineer with the New York Telephone Company and aided in the corporation's membership drive.

It was announced that the first of a major advertising

venture to attract attention to the town would be started in the February issue of "Industrial Development."

A campaign to open the corporation's associate membership to the whole community will be started shortly. The current membership of over 110, in addition to yearly dues, has pledged over \$35,000 for use if a desirable industry needs financial assistance.

The associate membership will permit anyone in the town concerned about rising taxes to aid in the attempt to create a more balanced tax base. Dues will be \$5.00 a year but no additional pledge will be required.

In the last year approximately \$4,000,000 of new industrial construction was started or proposed for the town.

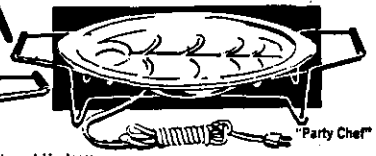
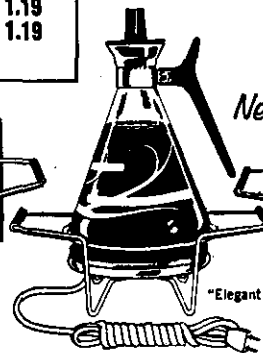
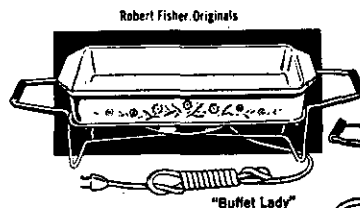

"Great Decisions"

This February the World Affairs Council, in affiliation with the Foreign Policy Association, begins its sixth season of "Great Decisions" discussions in the Albany area. Small groups of interested people will meet over an eight-week period to consider topics of importance in America's relations with other countries. These discussions will be stimulated and guided by Fact Sheets distributed by the World Affairs Council (price \$1.50 a set, \$75 a set for students). At the close of each discussion participants will cast their votes for some courses of action in meeting our foreign affairs problems.
