LETTER

Dear Sir:

At the public hearing on zoning at Town Hall on February 20, Mr. Schoonmaker made what seemed to be some very salient points which, unfortunately, apparently passed over the heads of the Town Board.

He started out by saying that he doubted the people of Bethlehem realized the full farreaching and deep-seated involvements of such an amendment as proposed by the Board for these reasons:

- 1. The change affects not merely a local district, such as Delaware Avenue, but restaurants and lunchrooms in the whole of Bethlehem, irrespective of location.
- 2. The fact that the application comes before the Board of Appeals in the first place automatically, in case of dispute, leads to court actions and litigation that might not be necessary if the zoning ordinance change was limited to Delaware Avenue.
- 3. Any lunchroom or restaurant no matter how long it has been in business desiring to build a substantial addition or extension will have to make application to the Board of Appeals for a special permit.
- 4. The real heart of the present controversy is the classification and meaning of a restaurant or lunchroom under the present zoning ordinance, and the amendment will not resolve this most pertinent question.
- 4. There is no need for an amendment. If the Town Board decides, as it should within its responsibility, whether the eatery under consideration is desirable or undesirable, it has merely to say so it is as simple as that.
- 6. No zoning ordinance of any other town excludes all restaurants and in this respect

Mrs. Lloyd Maeder will have charge of the program.


Carnival at Senior High
