

NANCY TUDICO AWARDED FIRST ANNUAL GLENMONT SCHOOL SCHOLARSHIP

Nancy J. Tudico, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Tudico of Glenmont, a former sixth grade pupil at the Glenmont Elementary School and a senior at Bethlehem Central School in Delmar, has been awarded the first Glenmont PTA Scholarship Grant. The award represents \$300 which will be given to Miss Tudico in two payments; one in September, the other prior to the beginning of the second semester of the student's freshmen year in college.

Miss Tudico has been active in the Future Teachers of America Club as Chaplain and a member of its Activities Committee, chairman of the Points Committee and president of the Club in her senior year.

She is on the School Year Book Staff, has been a member of the Spanish Club and in her junior year was a participant in the Canteen Show.

Music activities include membership in the concert choir for 3 years, the Chansonettes, the Choraliers and the Starlighters.

The alternate chosen by the Scholarship Selection Committee of the Bethlehem Senior High School is George Kondred Parry, son of Mr. and Mrs. George Parry of Feura Bush Road, Delmar, also a former Glenmont Elementary School pupil.

The Glenmont PTA will continue to present this award annually to a Bethlehem Senior who has completed the final two years of his elementary school at Glenmont. The selection is based on sincerity of desire of the student to continue his education and scholastic achievement.

Soon after the Glenmont School was established in 1956, its PTA concluded that a scholarship program for students was the one worthy project it wished to promote. A Scholarship Committee was formed and worked for several years formulating procedures to be followed in establishing the Scholarship as an annual award.

PTA members and many friends of the school in the vicinity of Glenmont have given countless hours to the PTA's major money raising event, the Glenmont Variety Show which was presented annually under the direction of John Schoch for the past four years. Taking part in the presentation will be Mr. Carl Kundel, PTA president, Mr. Richard Hussey, chairman of the Scholarship Committee, and Miss Ruth Doyle, sixth grade teacher at the time Miss Tudico was at Glenmont.



CHURCH PLANS EDUCATION WING

Plans for expansion of the First Methodist Church of Delmar located at 428 Kenwood Avenue are progressing, following approval by the congregation last November 18 and authorization by the Quarterly Conference December 17.

Construction, scheduled to start this spring following a building fund campaign, will consist primarily of a new education wing, a two-story L shaped structure 50 x 125 feet. Also included in the plans are numerous improvements in existing buildings to provide an enlarged fellowship

With recently purchased property adjoining the present property on the east and west, the church will have a continuous frontage of 384 feet on Kenwood Avenue and 220 feet on Nathaniel Boulevard, Four existing frame buildings will be razed to provide off-street parking space for 170 cars.

"We are now faced with the challenge of a growing church in a rapidly expanding community," said Rev. Arthur P. White, pastor for the past 17 years. "Our needs are evident to anyone who moves through the church school on a Sunday morning or any evening during the week," he said.



Architects are Charles A. Schade and William N. Marden, associate, of Albany who

have designed numerous churches in the capital district.

The original Methodist Church in Delmar (then called Adamsville) was erected 130 years ago - in 1833 - at 413 Kenwood Avenue. In 1873, a new sanctuary was built at 428 Kenwood Avenue where the present church now stands. A major building program was accomplished in 1929 with the construction of a parish house in the rear of the sanctuary. The sanctuary was enlarged in 1952.

ASSOCIATION TO HAVE MEETING NEXT TUESDAY, MAR. 19

The organizing committee of the Delaware Avenue Area Development Association, a newly organized association of citizens interested in planning and zoning matters in the Town of Bethlehem, has announced the finalization of plans for a public meeting to air the subject at the Elsmere Grade School on Tuesday, March 19, at 8 p.m. Residents and business people of the town are cordially invited to attend, a spokesman for the Committee reported.

A sub-committee which has been active in formulation of the program indicates that the meeting will be organized so as to cover the program in a minimum period of time and to allow for discussion and questions from the floor. The meeting is reportedly being held in response to the growing interest within the community in the subject of orderly residential-business-professional development of what the Committee has referred to as "a community in the process of rapid growth and transition."

Principal speaker on the program will be Roger L. Creighton, a noted planner, who is presently Director of Upstate New York Transportation Studies, an agency of the State Department of Public Works. Mr. Creighton has directed much of the metropolitan area planning in the Niagara Frontier and was formerly Associate Director of the Chicago Area Transportation Study and also Planning Director for the City of Portland, Maine. He resides on Devon Road, Delmar.

In addition to Mr. Creighton, the Committee will present Mrs. George W. Hemstead, whose interests and accomplishments in community activities of this nature are widely known. To round out the program, one or two others who are intimately acquainted with matters of planning and zoning in the Town of Bethlehem will speak.
