
#### Baton Recital

accepted at one or more schools.

Dr. Bookbinder, who succeeded Philip Auerbach in the Bethlehem Central guidance post last fall, believes in encouraging pupils to aim their sights high. "We're not trying to set any kind of acceptance record," he told me. "We want each youngster to attend a college that will really challenge him."

Among the acceptances that have been received to date, a good percentage are from toprated, "name" schools, including Harvard, Yale, Princeton and other Ivy League colleges. About 70 per cent of Bethlehem Central's graduates do continue their education beyond high school.

Dr. Bookbinder supervises a counseling staff of seven persons, three at the Junior High School and four at the Senior High. He is a graduate of Penn State, and earned his master's and doctor's degrees at the Teachers College of Columbia University.

He served as director of guidance services for the East Greenbush Central School District for six years, prior to his appointment here. He and his wife live at 50 Darroch Road in Delmar.

His major year-round goal, he said, is to help pupils achieve as well as they are able in their schoolwork. He and his staff try to iron out learning problems, by working with parents and teachers as well as the pupils themselves.

He is concerned with aiding pupils in selection of high school courses and vocational plans, in addition to college plans, Representatives of different careers visit Bethlehem Central Senior High School every week, and youngsters who might be interested in each career are

notified to meet with the representatives.

Career films and trips to industry sites are arranged from time to time, and representatives of various colleges also visit the school regularly to talk with pupils.

"We try to help those youngsters who don't plan to go to college just as much as the ones who do," Dr. Bookbinder pointed out. "Mrs. Hosey," he said, "does an excellent job of working with her business students to see that they obtain good positions."

Referring again to his task of guiding pupils into the "right" college for them, he explained that "there are no guarantees anymore."

Sometimes a college will turn down one pupil and accept another with a lower average, he said. Since there is no sure way of knowing just what a college is looking for, he
