

Players Announce Cast of Final Play

Lois Morrison of Voorheesville will appear as Julia McKinlock and John Moore of Delmar as Paul d'Argenson.

Fairchild, the chauffeur and Sabrina's father, will be portrayed by Art Floetz of Feura Bush, and Mary Freeman of Slingerlands will play the maid, Margaret.

The romantic comedy, a light and engaging look at the upper upper crust, first was performed by the Playwrights Company of the National Theater. It opened on November 11, 1953, in New York City, with Margaret Sullivan and Joseph Cotton as Sabrina and Linus, Jr.

The play subsequently was made into a movie, starring Audrey Hepburn, William Holden and the late Humphrey Bogart.

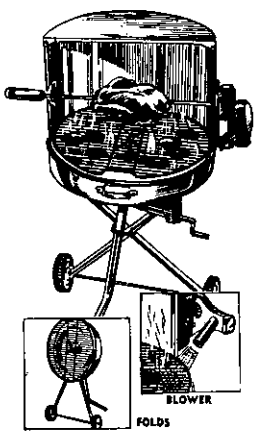

will be on hand; many of them meeting again for the first time since their graduation.

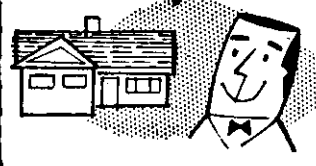

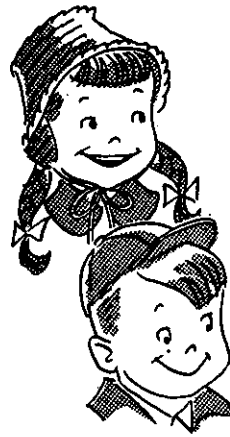
New Seating Policy Is Announced by Players
