Players Announce Cast of Final Play

Linus Larrabee, Sr., will be played by Charles Losacco of Delmar, and Dorice Nelson of Albany will appear as his wife, Maude. Scott Benn of Loudonville will portray David, the other Larrabee son, and Mimi Scott of Albany will play his ex-wife, Gretchen.

Lois Morrison of Voorheesville will appear as Julia Mc-Kinlock and John Moore of Delmar as Paul d'Argenson.

Fairchild, the chauffer and Sabrina's father, will be portrayed by Art Ploetz of Feura Bush, and Mary Freeman of Slingerlands will play the maid, Margaret.

The romantic comedy, a light and engaging look at the upper upper crust, first was performed by the Playwrights Company of the National Theater. It opened on November 11, 1953, in New York City, with Margaret Sullivan and Joseph Cotton as Sabrina and Linus, Jr.

The play subsequently was made into a movie, starring Audrey Hepburn, William Holden and the late Humphrey Bogart.
