"Mike likes many sports and does well in them," Mr. Lephart told me. "Naturally I encourage him, especially with his swimming, but how far he wants to go with it, is up to him. My wife and I don't believe in pushing our kids too much."


Mr. Lephart, who was swimming coach at Bethlehem Central before assuming his RPI


