

YOU CAN HELP THE LITTLE LEAGUE TOMORROW

The Tri-Village Little League will hold its Booster Drive on Friday evening, May 10. On that day, Little Leaguers will make a house-to-house canvass for contributions in support of the 1963 Little League baseball program. A schedule for the coming season will also be left at each home.

The Booster Drive is a "one-shot" affair that is conducted once a year in order to raise funds for the Little League program. This program, which permits every Tri-Village youngster to play organized baseball, requires a large outlay of money for fields and equipment. Chairman of the drive, Harold Garringer, states that the importance of this drive cannot be overemphasized in that the League Budget for the coming year is greater than \$9,000.00, which is the minimum amount to make available to about 500 boys the advantages of supervised team play and summer recreation.

President Chuck Kelly announces that residents of the Tri-Village area are cordially invited to attend this year's games and enjoy watching the youngsters play on three baseball fields at Magee Park which are owned and maintained in a beautiful condition by the townspeople without the aid of taxes from any source.

METHODIST CHURCH PLANS TO START BUILDING PROGRAM THIS MONTH - COMPLETION IN '64

Construction work on the new education wing of the Delmar Methodist Church and extensive improvements in the existing structure is expected to begin this month, according to Fayette C. Walworth, chairman of the building committee. Completion is scheduled for the first of next year.

Four buildings on adjacent land owned by the church on Kenwood Avenue will be razed to make room for the addition and for off-street parking. The buildings will be razed progressively over the next several months.

Low bidders for the project are: general contracting, Henry V. Rector, Inc., Rensselaer, N.Y.; plumbing and heating, Wilber and Ciarfello Corp., Delmar, N.Y.; electrical work, Gordon L. Hayes, Inc., Troy, N.Y. The architect is Charles A. Schade, Albany.

Total cost including land

acquisition, construction, grading, landscaping, furnishings, fixtures, etc. amounts to \$409,732. More than half of this amount has been obtained in pledges in a recent fund raising crusade.

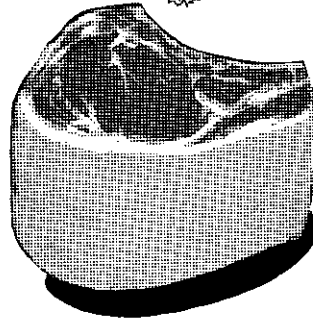

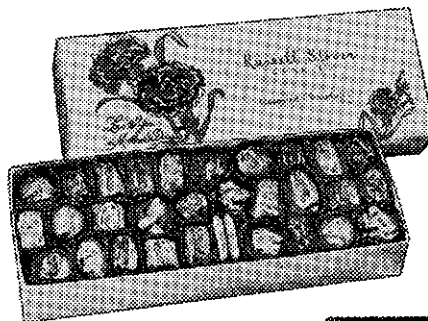

LETTER

To the people of the Town of Bethlehem:

I am very sorry to say that there is a sadist among us, and I hope there isn't any more than one.

About three weeks ago, a beautiful, playful collie dog, who idolized its mistress (Kathy Baxter) was scalded to death. There is a reward offered for information leading to the arrest of this sadist.


I have had a number of phone calls, asking the question, "what is a sadist?" I answer in this way: A sadist is a per-

son with a deteriorated mind. Psychiatric treatment is of no benefit to this type. They get delight in torturing animals of any kind, and they would not hesitate to scald a week old baby to death and have no regrets.

The State Bureau of Criminal Investigation has been called into this case, together with the State Troopers. Bethlehem has no room for this kind of a person and do not hesitate, if you have information regarding this person, to call me on the phone. All information is strictly confidential. The penalty for a crime of this kind, if convicted, carries a sentence of not less than 2 1/2 years or more than 7 1/2 yrs. before a County Court Judge.

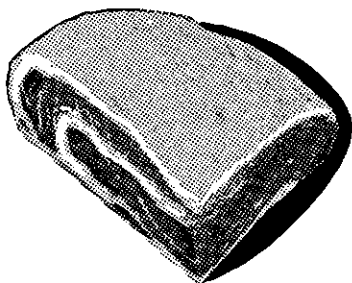

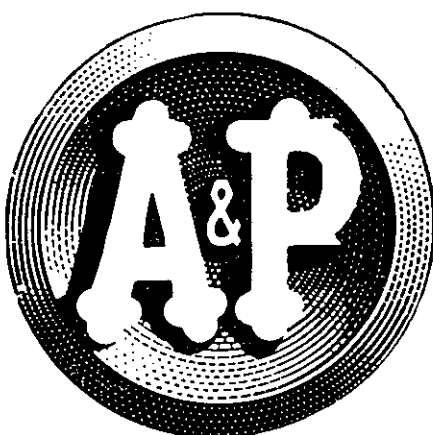

Students of Miss Sammy Ives, Mr. August Franze and Mr. Eugene Lewis, art teacher, have on display original prints made from linoleum blocks by this year's and previous year's classes. Studies in black and white with further experiments in arrangements and use of colors have resulted in dozens of attractive designs. Writings from sixth grade students are companion to the prints and sometimes illustrated by them with different people doing art and writings.

A study of Greek drama by Mr. Franze's class has produced papier-mache-masks of emotions, done in various paints including metallic. Glowing under the lights, these masks convey the strong feelings so needed by Greek drama.

In working with these prints, Miss Ives related the Group has been in contact with areas of artistic discipline with the demands for patience by the medium. By experimenting with each other's blocks, using several designs and combinations, the students have had much shared experience, a strong developer of good human relationship.
