An industrial accident seven years ago destroyed Mr. Haeusser's sight. A year later he decided to take up golf and was taught by Jerry Dwyer, pro at the Albany Municipal Gulf Course. Last year they teamed up in the Pro-Blind Tournament, held at Van Schoick Country Club and won the championship for the 1962 season.

Mr. Haeusser is a member of Nathaniel Adams Blanchard Post #1040, American Legion, which has sponsored the Memorial Day Parade in Delmar for the past 34 years. Euring World War II Legionnaire Haeusser was a Gunner's Mate 1st Class on Amphibious Gauboatt LCSL 14. The Heldeberg Workshop, a non-profit program administered on a volunteer basis by local parents will provide pupils from the second grade through junior and senior high school with the opportunity to choose a specialized subject and be a part of a class limited to 20 pupils. 

SUMMER SESSION AT SAINT ROSE STARTS ON JUNE 27

Graduate courses in special education, audio-lingual French, and radiation biology, undergraduate courses in astronomy, Latin composition, and a new history course on the Soviet Union will be offered this year by both the graduate and undergraduate divisions of The College of Saint Rose.

Beginning June 27, the summer session will cover six weeks and is open to both men and women. Registration is now going on by appointment. Final registration dates are Friday, June 14, from 4 to 5:30 P.M. and from 7 to 9 P.M. and Saturday, June 15 from 2 to 5 P.M.

Continuing its program to prepare teachers for the mentally retarded, the graduate division will offer a three-week practicum in which prospective teachers will have an opportunity to observe approved teach-. ing techniques in an actual classroom setting. The course is approved for training grants by the New York State Education Department. Courses on organic speech disorders and speech correction will also be offered, leading to a master of arts degree in speech correction and hearing.

A course in Latin American Civilization taught by Rev. Michael McCloskey, O.F.M., chairman of the history department at Siena College inaugurates a cooperative graduate program, now being planned, between Siena and Saint Rose. Father McCloskey is exchanging with Sister Eileen Joseph, C.S.J., chairman of the history department at The College of Saint Rose. Sister Eileen Joseph will teach French Revolution and the Napoleanic Era in the Siena Graduate School this summer.

The intensive teacher training program enabling liberal arts college graduates to teach in the elementary grades will be offered by the graduate division for the 11th consecutive year. A demonstration school showing approved teaching techniques and actual classroom settings, attended by approximately 100 children from kindergarten through the first six grades, will be held in the Father Charles Memorial School.

A special reading course dealing with problems in teaching classroom reading in the elementary school will also be offered. Seminar courses on the graduate level will be conducted in the fields of English, history, business education and philosophy.

In the undergraduate division. a new course in history and political science on the Soviet Union will be offered. Astronomy will be taught again this summer, as will numerous courses in biology, anatomy, chemistry and physics. Business Administration and Economics of Consumption will be among the many courses taught in the field of Economics. Among the language courses offered will be Elementary German, French Reading, Conversation, and Composition; Advanced Spanish Grammar and Composition, and Latin Composition.

Other special undergraduate courses will be Foundations of Mathematics, Differential Calculus, History and Appreciation of Music, Design and Color, and numerous English courses to help teachers to meet certification requirements. A course in Children's Literature and Drama will be a mong these

As in other years, the undergraduate programs will also include courses in a variety of other fields including, elementary and secondary education with methods on both elementary and secondary levels, philosophy, world geography, sociology, and business education.
