BETHLEHEM'S COMMUNITY AMBASSADOR FOR 1963

Mrs. John J. Cunningham of Feura Bush Rd., Delmar, has been selected from among 8 applicants as the 1963 Bethlehem Community Ambassador. The announcement was made by Mrs. Jessie Rezzemini, Chairman of the Selection Committee at a reception held recently by the project officers and friends in the library of the Bethlehem Senior High School.

As the 10th successive Community Ambassador, Mrs. Cunningham will spend two months in Turkey this summer. The first month she will live with a Turkish family, while the second month will involve travel with a special group, including one member of her Turkish family. Although they will do some sightseeing, the main interest of the group is meeting the people with the hope of obtaining a better understanding and appreciation of Turkish life and culture. Upon her return in early September, Mrs. Cunningham will be available for speaking engagements before local clubs and organizations.

A graduate of the College of St. Rose, where she was recently elected to the Alumnae Board of Directors, Mrs. Cunningham also holds a Masters degree in Social Studies from The State University of New York at Albany. Her teaching career includes 3 years at Colonie Central High School and 3 years of teaching 9th grade Social Studies and substitute teaching at Bethlehem Central Junior High School.

She feels that her background in history, geography and political science (having both studied and taught them) will be helpful to her in a project of this type. In addition, she is doing considerable independent research on Turkey, including a study of the Turkish language, through records. Her husband is an Albany attorney associated with Halter, Sullivan and Rehfuss and they have a 3 1/2 year old son.

While in Istanbul, Mrs. Cunningham hopes to meet with Dr. Matthew Elbow (of Delmar)

one of her former Professors at Albany State, who is now on leave from that College and is spending the year as a guest Professor at the American Robert College in Istanbul. Since Dr. Elbow specializes in studying the Middle East, she feels he will be an invaluable asset to her own understanding of Turkey and environs.

TESTING FOR TB

Pediatrition in Charge Tuberculous Division, Jefferson Davis Hospital Huston, Texas

Adults can be bad medicine for babies. Bad in the sense that they can give children tuberculosis.

Babies aren't born with TB and they don't get it from the milk they drink -- at least in this country. But more than 2,000 future citizens under five years of age have active tuberculosis. They get it from the air which they have to breathe to stav alive.

Very young childern get TB because they breathe in tubercle bacilli that have been spawned in the air by grown persons in close contact with

Fortunately, it is easy to test a baby for tuberculosis. A tuberculosis culin test will tell the story. These are remarkably sensitive skin tests which cause a reaction if there is ininfection.

Nowadays, most pediatritions advise prophylactic treatment for the tuberculin positive child. This calls for a drug known as "isoniazid" for at least a year. Sometimes a second drug is advised. This is commomly known as PAS, instead of the tonguetangling word, "para-aminosaliticylic" acid.

However, studies have shown

that "isoniazid" alone is very effective to provide the necessary protection. It has been shown that this drug will prevent the development of serious disease among children who already are infected with tubercle bacilli.

Treatment, of course, is the first step, but it is urgent that the sourse of infection be found, to prevent further exposure. This means examination of all persons in close contact with the child: relatives, friends, or domestics. They should be given a tuberculin test and chest

X-rays. If a case of active tuberculosis is found, the victim should be placed under treatment immediately, and the child should be protected from further contact.

Tuberculosis is usually thought of as a disease of older people, but infants are highly susceptible to it. The disease usually takes a serious course with them. Common sense calls for regular tests of children so that treatment can begin at the first sign of danger.
