

GARDEN BOOKS PRESENTED TO DELMAR PUBLIC LIBRARY

Mrs. Julia White, last president on record of the Tri-Village Flower Show, has presented to the Delmar Public Library on behalf of the organization four exceptional books on flowers and gardening.

Many Bethlehem residents remember and took part in the Tri-Village Flower Shows of 1936-1947 which were held at the present Bethlehem Central Junior High School. Started in 1936 by donations from the Delmar Progress Club and the Masons, Bethlehem Lodge 1096, the show flourished until the war years, then resumed until 1947. A truly community project in which many took part, the Tri-Village Flower Show in September of each year brought much enjoyment to the area. By vote of the Executive Committee this summer the remaining funds have been used to present to the Library the following books: Complete Guide to Flower Arrangement, by Fort; In Wildness is the Preservation of the World with quotations from Thoreau, a book of exceptional beauty; Garden Plants in Color, a most comprehensive coverage of trees, shrubs, and vines photographed in color and with brief note on growth, climate, and use. The fourth volume is Russell Page's Education of a Gardener for winter planning, to delight any gardener.

"The Library borrowers," said Mrs. Barbara R. Rau, Librarian "will keep green the memory of the Tri-Village Flower Show for years."

\$100 Million Atomic Power Electric Generating Plant Planned By Niagara Mohawk near Oswego, New York

State Commerce Commissioner Keith S. McHugh today congratulated the Niagara Mohawk Power Company on its "exciting decision" to build a \$100 million atomic power electric generating plant near Oswego.

In a telegram to company president Earle J. Machold, Commissioner McHugh said: "I have just learned of your exciting decision to construct a \$100 million atomic power facility in the Oswego area and hasten to add my congratulations. This new electric power generator will be another fine step forward in the growing

economy of our State and should add immeasurably to industrial development and the provision of more job opportunities for our people."

The facility will be one of the largest atomic power installations in the country, with a generating capacity of 500,000 kilowatts, and is expected to be ready for operation late in 1968. It will be located on 1,500 acres on the shores of Lake Ontario, about six miles east of Oswego and will be of the "water reactor" type. The project is subject to approval by the U.S. Atomic Energy Commission.

Darby Dan Farm's Chateaugay, winner of the Belmont Stakes and the Kentucky Derby and second in the Preakness. heads the probable field for the 46th running of the \$75,000 added Dwyer Handicap at Aqueduct next Saturday (July 13).

The Dwyer, at a mile and a quarter for three-year-olds, heads the week's program but two-year-olds have a stakes opportunity on Wednesday in the \$25,000 added Tremont at five and a half furlongs. Being run for the 71st time this year, the Tremont is the second of the four races comprising the New York Series for Two-Year-Olds.

Glenelg Stable's Raritan Valley, surprise winner of the Lamplighter Handicap on June 29, is expected to challenge Chateaugay in the Dwyer. Raritan Valley, in chalking up his first stakes victory, defeated the Wheatley Stable's Insurrection a half length. Insurrection also is an expected starter in the Dwyer.

Another expected starter is Mrs. Alfred Giordano's Hot Dust, winner of the Governor's Handicap at Suffolk and second to Crewman in the Leonard Richards at Delaware a race in which Raritan Valley was sixth and Insurrection fifth.



Savings Banks Lists Growth Over Past Three Years

Assets of the Mechanics Exchange Savings Bank of Albany have increased 20% since merger of the Albany Exchange Savings Bank and The Mechanics and Farmers Savings Bank in 1960, according to an announcement made today by Addison J. Keim, President. Mr. Keim said that the assets of the merged banks on April 11, 1960, totaled \$62 million. On July 1, 1963, the assets totaled \$75 million.

Mr. Keim also stated that the mortgage portfolio of the Bank has increased 40% since the merger, from \$41 million in 1960 to \$59 million in July 1, 1963.

Mr. Keim said surplus and reserves are in excess of 10% of deposits.

The Mechanics Exchange Savings Bank since its merger has opened 2 additional offices. Its new Capitol Hill Office is located at 111 Washington Avenue and an office has been opened at Stuyvesant Plaza, an important shopping center in the western outskirts of the city.





HAPPY ANNIVERSARY

One of the busiest and bestloved buildings in our community is the Delmar Public Library, which this year celebrates its 50th anniversary.

Tri-Villagers who haven't made use of the library's various facilities must be few and far between. Operating with an \$86,000 annual budget, it has a circulation of about 200,000, and a collection of 35,000 books.

Mrs. Barbara Rau, head librarian, kindly took a few minutes from her full schedule this week to tell me some pertinant facts about our first-rate local library.

It was founded in 1913 by a group within the Delmar Progress Club, and its first site was a janitor's supply closet in the Delmar Elementary School. In 1916, the present library site was donated by the Adams Estate and the first building was erected - what is now the adult reading lounge.

In 1931, the Bethlehem Cen-

tral School District assumed the administration of the library and the first bookmobile, an old panel truck, was put into use. The library is now using its third bookmobile, known affectionately as "Babe, the Blue Ox,") (Paul Bunyan fans will recognize the name) and driven on its rounds by Mrs. Pearl Carman.

A Friends of the Delmar Public Library Committee was formed in 1953, headed by Charles Armstrong, to coordinate a fund-raising project for building expansion. So much was generously donated by members of the community that the additions made the building 12 times larger than it had been originally.

The present building was completed in August of 1954. Since then, additions have included a bookmobile garage, a storage room, a work room, an enclosed porch behind the children's book section, new windows and 2,000 feet of shelf space. All this has been done, Mrs. Rau proudly pointed out, while the tax rate hasn't varied more than one cent per \$1,000.

On the library payroll are 22 people, including seven full-time workers. They are Mrs. Rau, Mrs. Carman, Mrs. Frances Spatz, Mrs. Pauline Davis, Mrs. Mary Benson, Mrs. Janet Berry, and Mrs. Mary Wasserbach. The part-time employes include six pages, teenagers

who shelve books after they've been returned, and about whom Mrs. Rau says, "They are excellent workers, and we couldn't do without them."

All books in the library are loaned for two-week periods, and free of charge. Between 550 and 600 new books are purchased each month, so that newly-published books are readily available.

The library also has collections of records, sheet music, pamphlets, and periodicals published within the last five years. Back issues of 110 magazines are kept on file, and Mrs. Rau is pleased to note that much use is made of this collection. "It takes up space, but it's worth it," she told me.

Among the periodicals on the subscription list are many from foreign countries, including ones published in India, Kenya, France, England, and Puerto Rico.

One library project much appreciated by many of its users is its Pre-school Reading Program. Every year, from October through June, three reading hours are held each week for four-year-olds.

Mrs. Jean Herrmann, a former kindergarten teacher, conducts the story hours and the children love them. Mrs. Rau said they try to keep each hour's enrollment to about 25, but have had as many as 50 young book devotees on hand at one time.

Exhibits of art work done by people within the community are put on display at the library each month, under the chairmanship of Mrs. Clover Mikol. Since this practice was instituted seven years ago,







about 80 local artists have had their work shown there. The display now is of art projects done by junior high school pupils, and it includes many charming chalks, pastels, watercolors, and even some birds constructed of crepe paper.

Mrs. Evelyn Sanvidge is in charge of the library's exhibit case, which serves as a show-case for unusual collections owned by persons in the Tri-Village area. In the case, for library visitors to admire, have been carved animals, rare pewter, silver and glass collections. One recently displayed was Strawberry Luster, a china pattern made in England in 1650, and owned by Mrs. Helen Howd.

The Delmar Bookmobile is, of course, one of the library's most popular features. It travels the 77 square miles of the

school district all year round, reaching every stop point every two weeks. In 1958, "Babe" traveled all the way to Russia, to be put on display at the American Exposition.

Hours of the library are from 1 to 9 p.m. in the summer, (closed Saturdays) and from 2 to 9 p.m. - and 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. on Saturdays - during the rest of the year.

Present members of the Library Board, serving five-year terms, are Dr. Theodore C. Wenzl, president; Raymond Spout, treasurer; Mrs. E. L. Cheatum, secretary; Mrs. Robert Birchenough, and Dr. George Wessinger.

Already in the works is a big 50th Anniversary Celebration, which will be incorporated into the library's 5th Annual Outdoor Show next October.




