The meeting will open with a Covered Dish Supper at 6. The regular business meeting will follow the dinner.

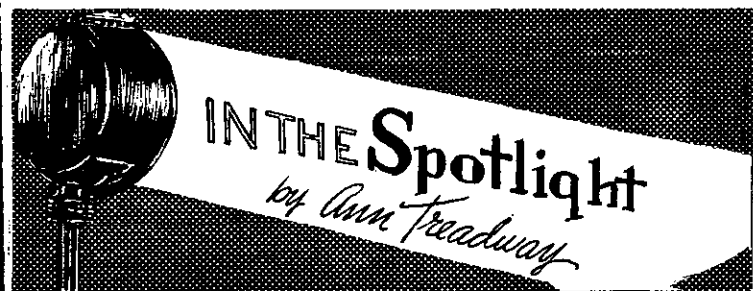

The Clarksville Civic Club will have its first meeting of the season of the Clarksville School Auditorium on September 20 at 8:30 P.M.

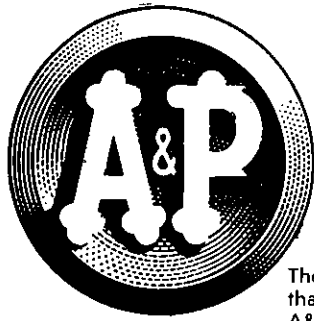
