





. . . or hurries it along. When a skip yells "let it curl" . . . not a broom swishes . . . and when he shouts "up broom, " the reaction of not sweeping is instantaneous!

By this time you must know that "curling" is a sport based, on TEAM play. That's why there are such ardent followers. The game possesses a culture which inculcates the finest principles of sportsmanship and comradship. It is a gentleman's game . . . and the contribution of each player is equally important to its success. When those "in the know" go out on the ice there is a quiet, penetrated only with calls of "sweep," After a stone is played, one sees the entire rink. . . but particularly the skip . . . raise brooms. This is the skip's way of saying "thank you" to his team-mate. There is no criticism or rough talk. It just isn't "the way of curling." Off the ice, the players "stack" their brooms and the spirit of conviviality prevails.

There are some who curl because it is a sport one can do


