## 50 Voters Sign Petition

The Town of Bethlehem provides fine schools, but not one park. Let us take action now to remedy this situation in form of a Memorial Recreation Park, so fitting to the memory of active, dedicated men.

## Park Need Stressed

Dear Editor,

We need a park not a war memorial. A Bethlehem war memorial will not ease the pain of those who lost loved ones or bring back one eye, leg or arm of the living.

We should act in the present with an eye to the future. This community will grow like all others because it is close to a capitol city. We should act to preserve a substantial area of green in or right next to the populated area. We should purchase acreage where people can go to observe nature and meet for band concerts and other outdoor activities. If we wait too long it may be too late.

Veterans of good-will are more interested in establishing a place where the children of the community and families can go for respite. Progressive communities do have a park which can be used for a worthwhile purpose.

If some feel that we must (45 years after World War I and almost 20 years after World War II) have a memorial for veterans, then the park can be dedicated to all veterans

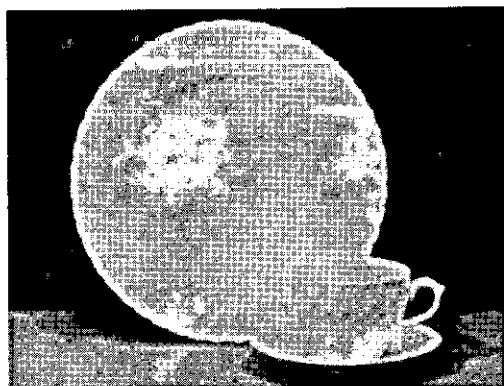

A few weeks ago this column attempted to explain what Home Demonstration activity is all about. It brought a request for "equal time" for local Home Bureau members - and I'm happy to comply.

The Home Bureau organization is an outgrowth of Home Demonstration agencies. The latter are government-sponsored. Back in 1956, many Home Dem unit members felt they would like to learn more about various crafts. But the Home Demonstration program didn't include any instruction in crafts.

So the many women who desired to learn such skills as making mosaic tile designs and making flowers out of fabric got together and organized

on their own. The Albany County unit was officially organized just last January, and has almost 200 members.
