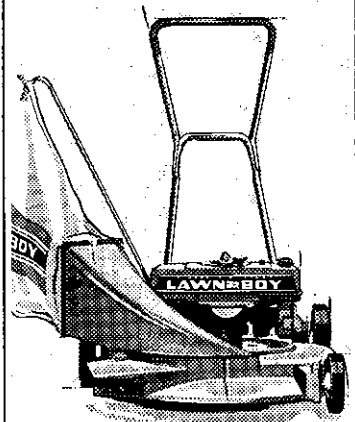

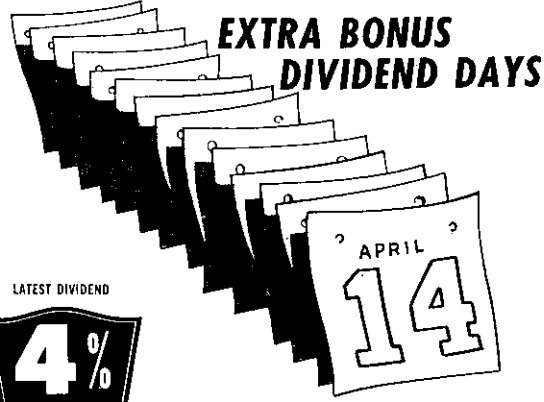

FRANK LUCARELLI TO TEACH AT HELDEBERG WORKSHOP

The National Aeronautics and Space Administration Spacemobile and two teacher-lecturers will move into the Albany area from August 10th through August 28th as part of the Heldeberg Workshop's "Adventure in Learning."

In an announcement from NASA Headquarters in Washington, D.C., Mr. John Sims, Chief of the Spacemobile Services Branch, office of Educational Programs and Services, said, "This will be a pilot program, the first time that NASA has attempted working with elementary and high school students for a prolonged period of time."

Mr. Sims also said that he was singularly impressed by the desire of the Heldeberg Workshop to seek the best of specialized teaching talent for the students of the Capital District, and that this was the primary

factor in the election of the Voorheesville program for the experimental classes.

Mr. Frank Lucarelli, a native of Schenectady, and formerly of the Scotia-Glenville school system, will be one of the teachers assigned by NASA to teach a class in space science to elementary students during the August program.

Mr. Lucarelli is no stranger to the Heldeberg Workshop, having headed the science staff for two summers. Since join-

ing NASA, he has taught and lectured throughout Italy and Austria as well as presenting the nation's space program in over five hundred schools in the United States.

Not only will the two NASA teachers have a class for students who are interested in delving deeply into space science, but they will also spend time with each of the other classes relating the various areas of study to the new concepts being formulated as a result of space technology and exploration. They will use the equipment and models of the Spacemobile as well as films and slides. Students will conduct experiments and demonstrations and there will be ample opportunity for original thinking and research.

Wassau Appoints Dewey

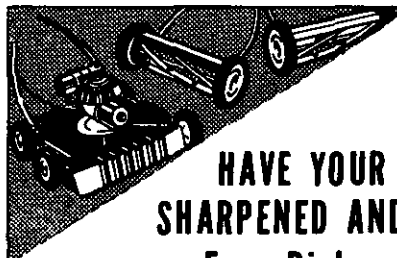
Employers Mutuals of Wausau has appointed Byron N. Dewey, 124 Mosher Road, manager of safety and health services in its Milwaukee branch.

The agency selects adoptive parents after a home study has been made. The worker talks with the adoptive parents about a particular child and they see him. John doesn't know it but this couple who hold and talk to him and see him as a beautiful baby boy will become his parents. The agency feels there is value in completing families and will consider two, and on a selective basis three children for a given home.

Family and Children's Service is a voluntary, non-sectarian social service agency whose prime purpose is to strengthen and stabilize families and individuals. The agency's service program includes family counseling, foster home care of pre-adoptive infants, adoption, and counseling with unmarried mothers. Its staff is made up of professional

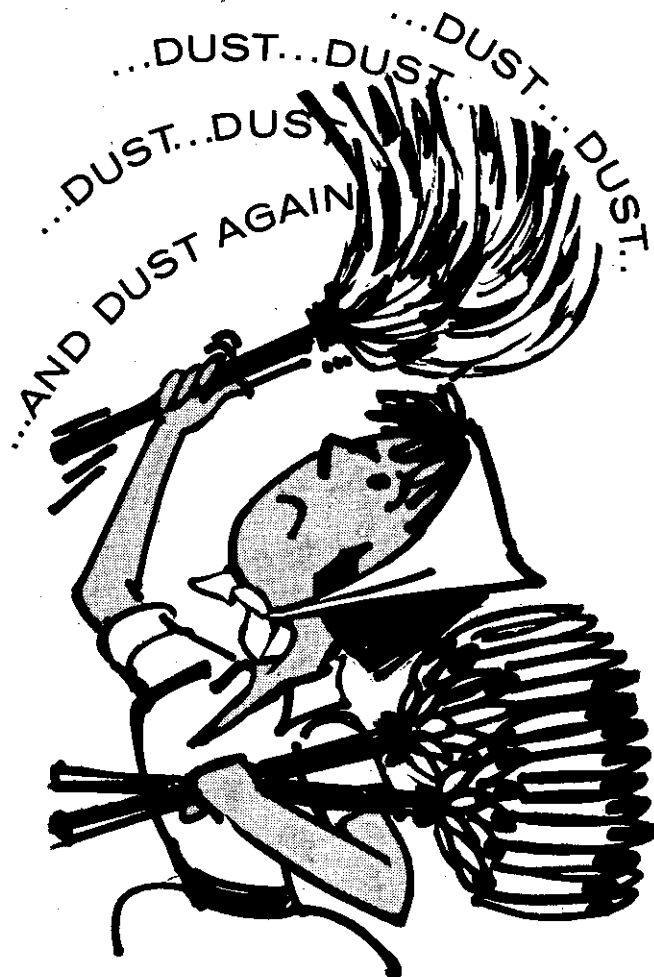

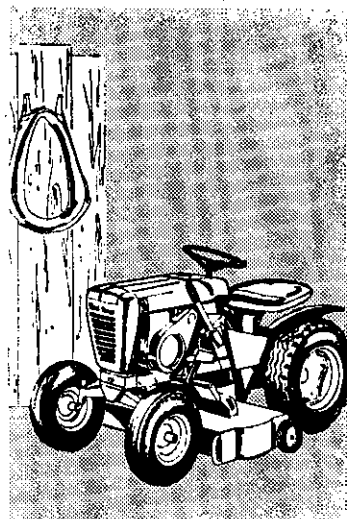

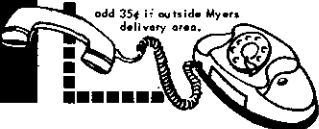

HELPING BABY SPEAK - - -

During baby's early months, it is important that he be allowed to experiment with sound. This is baby's pre-linguistic stage when his expressions are self-taught. He learns to develop all the muscles later used in speech. He learns to swal-

low, coo, burp, cry and breathe. He discovers tone, inflection and rhythm.

When baby is between the ages of seven and nine months, he reaches the linguistic stage in his speech development. At this stage baby usually is ready to learn a language, to associate sound with objects, person and concept. It is at this stage that parents can play an important role in baby's speech development.

As baby reaches the linguistic stage, mother moves from her passive role to an extremely active one. Her first contribution is perhaps an unconscious one. She responds warmly when baby uses syllables such as "ma ma" and "da da" which are meaningful to her. As the child associates pleasurable sounds with specific persons and objects, he begins to realize two things: 1) that sounds bring pleasure to other people who hear them; 2) through sounds, he can get the things he wants.

It is here where our Atomic Age society can fail the child. Fifty years ago, or even 25, families grew up as a unit with parent, children and, perhaps, relatives spending a good deal of the time under the same roof. There was plenty of opportunity for verbal communication. A baby could absorb as much speech as his capabilities would allow.

Today, father rarely sees his child because he rises early to get to work and returns home after baby's bedtime. Mother

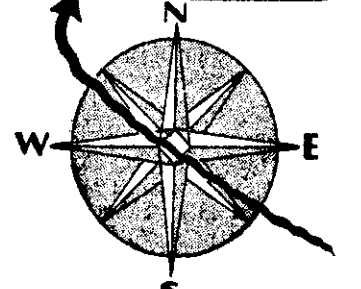

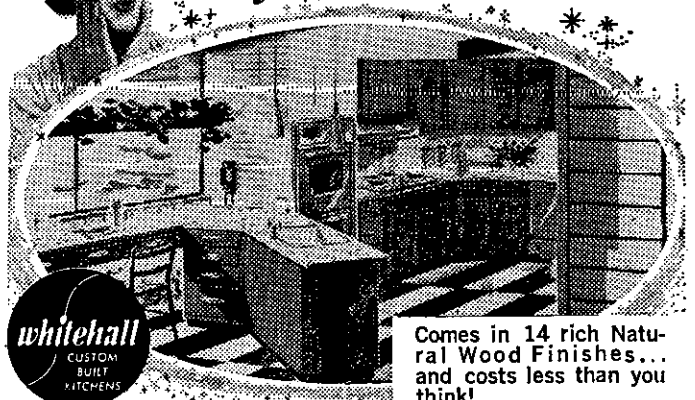
