





#### Junior College of Albany Will Have New Dean September 1



He succeeds John H. De-Witt, of Clinton Heights, who recently retired.


Mr. Burlingame joined the power company in 1949 as an engineer at Albany. He served in that capacity until 1962 when he was named a staff engineer.

Mr. Herzog announced that plans are progressing for the second annual club Spring dinner-dance to take place April 25. William Murphy is chairman of the dance committee.



#### NIAGARA MOHAWK PLANS **\$5-MILLION EXPANSION**

Niagara Mohawk Power Corporation will spend about \$5 million in its Albany District this year for expansion and improvement of its natural gas and electric facilities.

R. H. Stratton, administrative vice president, said the allocation is part of \$18.5 million the power firm will spend in 1964 on construction throughout its Eastern Division, roughly bordered by Hudson to the south, Port Henry to the north and St. Johnsville on the west.

Mr. Stratton said that the major project in the Albany area will add to the capacity of the 115,000 volt transmission system supplying the Capital District. The project includes

construction of a 230,000 volt transmission line from the company's New Scotland Station to the Reynolds Road station in North Greenbush. There, a 200,000 kilowatt transformer will be installed to reduce the voltage to supply four 115,000 volt lines serving the district. The new line will help provide for the growing demand for electric service in the Capital District, Mr. Stratton said.

Other Albany electric work includes installation of 34,500 volt underground transmission lines to supply a state-owned substation to be built beneath the South Mall platform, as well as removal of present power company gas and electric lines from the Mall area. A new 5,000 kilowatt substation is to be built on Seminole Street off Western Avenue to meet the growing power requirements in that section of the

city.

Mr. Stratton noted that another major project scheduled this year is the construction of a 26-mile natural gas pipeline to supply the increased demand in the Saratoga-Glens Falls areas. The gas will be supplied from an interconnection in Rotterdam, through three miles of 20-inch line and 23 miles of 16-inch pipe to a junction with the present gas line between Saratoga and Glens Falls. The job is scheduled for completion by next December.

New street lighting is tentatively planned for sections of Western and Washington Avenues, Lark Street and Delaware Avenue and at Albany Airport.

Natural gas line extensions are scheduled in several Colonie housing developments, on Elm Avenue in Glenmont and North Main Street in Voorheesville. Replacement of distribution


Mr. Stratton also pointed out that Niagara Mohawk will go forward in 1964 with its atomic power program, completing plans for a 500,000 kilowatt atomic power plant scheduled to go into operation near Oswego in 1968. Preliminary construction will begin early in 1965.

Another major system project will be installation of extensive

switching equipment near Syracuse and Utica to provide additional connections with the 345,000 volt transmission system that spans the state. These will enlarge and expand the capacity of the "gateways" through which large amounts of power can be delivered to Niagara Mohawk's system.

Mr. Stratton noted that Niagara Mohawk, one of the state's largest taxpayers, last year paid \$2,100,000 in city and county taxes in Albany County.
