
#### Scholarship Award Winner

## LETTER

To all our fellow citizens of the Bethlehem Central School District.

There are a number of reasons why Alan Hilchie's candidacy for member of the Board of Education of the Bethlehem Central School District is both welcome and advantageous to all of us, at this time.






