It would seem about time that adults started exhibiting at least a FEW good manners, especially if they expect to see any in their children.

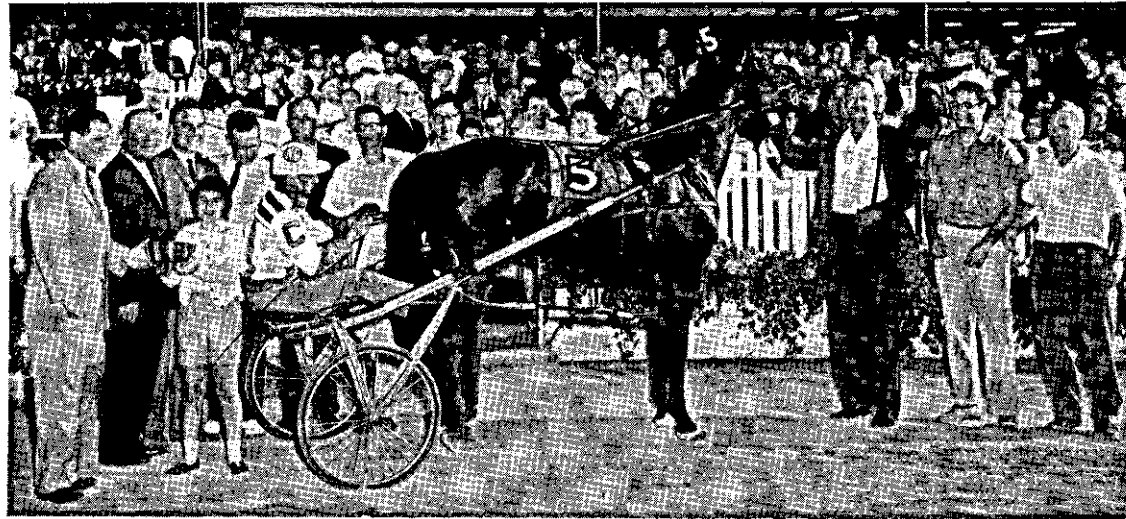

THE FANTASTICKS NOW PLAYING AT GREENVILLE

A whale of a big show is being presented by a small company at the Greenville Playhouse since last Saturday night, when THE FANTASTICKS opened a two-week run. C. Edwin Shade, of the Boston Conservatory of Music, is the director.

Although there are eight major roles in the record-breaking musical hit, it takes a crew of a dozen to keep the show going. In the Greenville production, many of the company will be doubling in off-stage jobs.

Sam Havens, who comes from Beaumont, Texas, is playing one of the fathers and has also designed the many spectacular lighting effects which enhance this charming show. A translucent backdrop will have lighting effects which make it become Venice, Athens and Bombay in one of the show's major musical production numbers, "We'll just dance."

THE FANTASTICKS, New York's longest-running show, tells of a girl and a boy brought together by a wall between their gardens, and then separated by the truths of a real life. Their illusions are shattered by the play's antagonist, a romantic Spaniard, played by George Van Den Houten, a former resident of Albany.
