Living with them now is Mrs. Maxwell's grandmother, Mrs. Hattie Dindore, who is originally from Ohio.

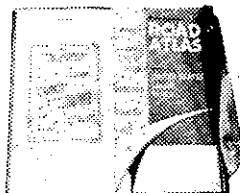
