

Firemen Install New Alert System

The Delmar Fire Commissioners are installing a new alerting system in the Delmar Fire District. The purpose is to call the Delmar Volunteer Firemen when their services are needed.

A new horn will be installed on the Delmar Fire Hall and in addition other sounding stations will be located throughout the fire district. The reason for the outlying stations is to improve the alerting qualities, making it possible for more volunteer firemen to hear the alarm.

The new system will utilize the fire boxes which have been in use for many years. The phone calls reporting fires through the phone exchange will still be sounded from the exchange. All alarms will be code recorded on a tape in the fire hall enabling the volunteer firemen to know where the apparatus should respond.

A feature of this new system will allow voice to be transmitted over the system to individual or all sounding stations. This feature will be utilized in the event a CD "All

Clear" is necessary, or if a catastrophe should warrant voice alerting to a certain section of our district. In the future, additional stations could be added as new areas are developed in our district.

Action was taken to have the latest in alerting systems installed in Delmar, when no objections were voiced at the public hearing in the Delmar Fire Hall. A visit to another community which already offers this modern, efficient alarm system to its residents, plus long and careful consideration, confirmed the need for a similar system in our own community.



Col. Howard R. Gmelch tirement testimonial dinner tendered him by fellow employees and military associates.



"Toys for Tots"

The 11th annual 'Toys for Tots' campaign, conducted by men of the U.S. Marine Corps Reserve in Albany, is underway and will continue until December 18, Capt. Patrick G. McDonald, commanding officer, announced today.

"If the present campaign is as successful as those in past years, we expect to make a lot of children happy this Christmas," Captain McDonald said.

A year ago, Marines, working with local businessmen and civic groups, collected 14,000 new and used toys which were turned over to the "Toys for Tots House," which is operated by the Arbor Hill Community Center, Catholic Charities, Clinton Square Neighborhood House and Trinity Institute. The toys were then distributed by members of these organizations to area needy children.

While "Toys for Tots" came to Albany only eleven years ago, the toy drive had its beginning in Los Angeles in 1947 as a community project of the Marine Reserves in that West Coast city. Other Marine Reserve units initiated similar campaigns in their home towns in more than 200 cities and 45 of the 50 states. More than 3 million toys are collected annually.

Last year, a total of 350 families with 1,625 children were provided toys from Albany alone.

Bypass Plans Shelved

The controversial connection between the Delmar and Slingerlands bypasses has been she lyed

The State Department of Public Works notified the Town of Bethlehem it was giving up the idea because of adverse action by the Town Board November 4.

I. Burch McMorran, DPW superintendent, notified Bethlehem Supervisor Bertram D. Kohinke of the decision in a lengthy letter in which he warned that the town faced increasing traffic problems in coming years.

The Delmar Bypass now is in use between Route 9W and Murray Avenue, The Slingerland bypass is under construction from the Crosstown Arterial near the State Campus in Albany to Krumkill Road. Another section is up for bidding this month extending to Mahar Road, beyond the Norman's Kill. Eventually the road will move farther west.

A North-South connector,

such as now being dropped, is badly needed engineers informed the DPW. Mr. McMorran turned further study of the problem over to the group studying Albany metropolitan area transportation.

In his letter to Mr. Kohinke. Mr. McMorran said:

"I am writing to advise you that as a result of the action of the Town Board of Bethlehem on Nov. 4, the Department of Public Works is withdrawing for the present its proposal for construction of the Slingerlands Bypass-Delmar Bypass Connection across the undeveloped gully west of Del-

"We have stated publicly on many occasions that this route would not be constructed without the approval of town officials. The resolution adopted Nov. 4 indicates the continuing and adamant opposition of the board to the proposal. While I recently suggested that the board reconsider its action.







Rocky Calls Special Session


Governor Rockefeller has summoned the Legislature into special session on December 15 to redraw district lines in as near as possible conformance with the United States Supreme Court's "one-man one-vote" mandate on apportionment of legislative representation.

"The public importance of legislative apportionment," the Governor said, "requires that it be considered at a special session, at which the Legislature can act unburdened by the weight of other matters."

Following the Supreme Court decision, a Federal District Court set April 1, 1965, as the deadline for enactment of a conforming reapportionment.

Governor Rockefeller said he will urge enactment of a plan "within the guidelines" pro-

vided in a report, Monday, by the seven-member Citizens Committee on Reapportionment which he appointed last July to study problems posed by the high court's decision.

A major recommendation of the Committee, in proposing enactment of an interim statutory reapportionment law as the only means of complying with the Federal Court's deadline, was that membership of the Senate be increased from the present 58 to a number not exceeding 65, and that of the Assembly from the present 150 to a number not exceeding 195.

The Committee, of which Dean William Hughes Mulligan of Fordham University Law School was Chairman, said county lines should continue to be respected in any apportionment plan, except where

To continue the historic New York State allocation of at least one Assembly seat to each county, the Committee said, would require either "weighted voting" or "fractional voting" for some Assemblymen. It questioned the wisdom of "total weighted voting" as a matter of policy and law.

Declaring "fractional voting" in the Assembly as worthy of Legislative consideration "if multi-county or divided county Assembly districting does not meet with legislative approval, "

the Committee explained:

"In a fractional voting plan, no legislator would have more than a single vote. Iegislators with a single vote would represent the great majority of districts. A smaller number of legislators would have a fraction of a vote, depending upon the population of the district represented."

Is it normal for a baby to be afraid? Many child psychiatrists believe that it is. They point out that all babies have basic fears during their emotional development.

The common fears of babyhood are familiar. For example, the fear of falling and the fear of a loud noise. As the infant grows, there's the fear of being separated from the parents, the fear of being hurt, the fear of darkness and the fear of strangers.

Some fears, however, are created by a specific event. The baby or child who is bittenby a dog becomes afraid of dogs. There are also fears that the parents, without meaning to, impress upon their babies. A mother who is afraid of thunder, for example, may pass her fear on to her baby.

In recent years, much has been learned about the many factors that cause fear in babies. One, that has concerned several studies is baby's instinctive fear



of losing the parent's love.

When the mother-baby relationship is not sufficiently satisfying, psychiatrists say, the child may develop the fear that he will fail his parents. The child, as a result, may try too hard to live up to the expectations of his parents so they will not punish him, hurt him, or discontinue their love. This fear leads to frustrations and to behavior problems.

Quite often, it is not so much the demand a parent makes that is unreasonable, but the premature timing of the demand. One example is a mother's insistence of the early toilet training of her baby.

When too much parental pressure is put on a baby to perform at a certain time and place, say psychiatrists, the baby, afraid of losing the mother's love and afraid of being punished, may not only show resentment for the toilet but may actually develop a real fear of going to the toilet.

This is one reason who many psychiatrists suggest that mothers keep their babies in diapers until about the age of two to permit the child to pick its own time. They believe that late toilet training is more natural. It is easier upon the baby and upon the mother. It contributes to less tension, less agravation, less fear and thus less danger of behavior problems developing as baby grows older.



Health Insurance Grows

Health insurance protects 48 million more Americans today than it did 10 years ago, the Health Insurance Institute said todav.

Ten years ago, over 97 million Americans were covered by hospital expense insurance. Since then there has been a coverage increase of nearly one-and-one half times, and a total of over 145 million per-

sons were protected against the cost of hospital care at yearend 1963, declared the Institute.

In 1953, 61 per cent of the U.S. civilian population was protected by some form of health insurance, the Institute said, while at the beginning of this year 77 per cent was so insured.

The same type of growth has been shown, said the Institute, by other forms of health insurance.

In 1953, nearly 81 million Americans had surgical expense insurance, but in the following 10 years there was a 67 percent increase in this coverage


The late John Oliver, former town supervisor, hired her as telephone receptionist in 1951






