LETTER

Editor's Note: The following letter, written by David G. Esmond and sent to his parents, is printed here because of the interest which has been shown in this project and the many offers of help that have been received.

Dear Friends,

Everything is going well and we're ahead of schedule. The community has accepted the project very well. The sheriff is reasonable. There is no Klan Organization here. This is an area of Mississippi in which there is a positive attitude toward all people getting along with each other.

I believe that many in Delmar and the Albany area will be interested in contributing to this project. However, this contribution would not be a present or a gift from those below in response to an attack of conscience. Rather, our community would be helping the people there do something they would have done anyway, but with money diverted from incomes often little above the subsistence level. Not to be concerned with these people is to kill something within ourselves.

These are people who should be our friends. We can learn much from them. They are poor in material things but not in humanity.

I'm living with a Negro family of nine in a five room house. Furnishings are sparse. The food is high in fat content, low in protein. The family has only a wood stove; yet they themselves are warm and friendly, their children intelligent and open hearted. They are proud, as they ought to be; yet they desperately need, and will gratefully accept, the kind of help which you can give by contributing to the project.








moved his family to the new home on Russell Road on December 14. The Griffins formerly lived at 9 Marjorie Dr. in Guilderland.

Mr. Hand believes that the creative work that goes into the artistic reproduction of the beauty in our world is, in itself, "an act of worship."


