

Slingerlands Players to Present "Five Finger Exercise"

Tue. & Sat., Jan. 22 & 23

The cast for the Slingerlands Community Players' second offering of the 1964-65 season, "Five Finger Exercise," has been announced by Ralph Smith, director of the drama by Peter Shaffer.

The three-act play will be presented Friday and Saturday, January 22 and 23, in the auditorium of Bethlehem Central High School. Curtain time is 8:40 p.m.

Appearing as Louise Harrington, mother of the well-to-do but troubled upper middle class English family, will be Ellen Heenehan. Mrs. Heenehan has appeared in many productions of the Players, including the role of Mrs. Gant in "Look Homeward, Angel."

Stanley Harrington, the self-made man who does not understand his family or their strivings for intellectual betterment, will be played by Arthur Ploetz, who is a veteran Player. Mr. Ploetz is remembered for his role as the prosecutor in SCP's production of "The Caine Court-Martial."

The Harrington's son, Clive, will be played by Sydney Turner, drama teacher at BCHS. Mr. Turner directed the Players' production of "The Dead Game" last spring and has appeared in a number of their plays, including "The Caretaker," presented before a state-wide drama society conference in Albany.

Pamela, the Harrington's teenage daughter, will be portrayed by Lila Geer, a junior at Bethlehem Central. Miss Geer appeared as the young Helen Keller in the school's production last spring of "The Miracle Worker," which was directed by Mr. Turner.

The German tutor, Walter Singer, whose presence in the Harrington household brings about a crisis, will be played

Dick Walsh. Mr. Walsh appeared in the role of the band leader in the Players' last drama, "Rashomon," in October.

Mr. Smith has been director

of other Players' productions in the past, including "The Rainmaker" and the one-act "Hope Is the Thing with Feathers," and has appeared in a number of roles in SCP plays. Assistant director is Mrs. Richard Rosenberg and coordinator is Mrs. Arthur Davis.

The play is a powerful and gripping drama which became a hit on Broadway several seasons ago, after a highly successful run in London. It deals unsparingly with the conflicts within and between the members of a family, revealing - layer by layer - depths of human need. The drama relies upon human insight for its intensity and interest, not upon plot gimmicks or theatrical showiness. As such, it should prove a more absorbing and rewarding experience for the audience.

Vote "Yea" on Garages: Kohinke

Supervisor Bertram E. Kohinke requests that all electors of the Town of Bethlehem vote in favor of purchasing the two garages owned by Mrs. F. H. Patterson - and part of which have been rented by the Town for several years.

These garages are located on Adams Street, just a short distance from Town Hall, and have been used for the storage of town equipment - there are in addition to what the town rents, six offices, and garage space of 80 ft. wide and 100 ft. long - total square feet of both garages 15,964 (all space).

These buildings and land have been appraised at \$105,000.00. The price to the town will be \$99,000.00 - and will be paid for over a twenty-year period. The annual rental cost of the space used by the town is \$6,250.00.

If the electors of our town vote in favor of purchasing these garages, it will make possible Town Hall expansion which is needed - and for additional town equipment storage space, which is very badly needed.

The voting will be held at the Town Hall, on Tuesday, January 19, 1965, between the hours of 12 noon and 8 P.M.

In order to vote at this election, a person must be an elector of the Town, and the owner of property assessed upon the last preceding town assessment roll.

IN THE Spotlight

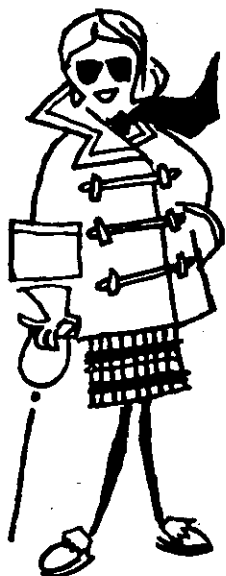

boating accident last summer.

The second dance was called the "Can of Food" dance. It was held a week later and this time the price of entry was a can of any kind of food. Five boxes were filled with the canned goods, which were later collected and distributed to needy families by a White Christmas committee.

William Fuller, director of the Bethlehem Recreation Department, told me that the kids themselves thought up the donate-and-dance ideas. "We tend to think that our young people are always taking," he pointed out, "but they can be very giving, too."

Incidentally, our Bethlehem Youth Center (alias The Canteen, alias The Pit) is now in its 10th year of existence in the basement of the Junior High School. An expansion program is presently in progress, to enlarge it to four separate rooms.

The Youth Center has, over the years, attracted a number of envious teenagers from neighboring communities, and some adults from East Greenbush are currently doing some

inquiring about how it operates, hoping, no doubt, that something similar might be established near their homes.

One further Recreation Department note: Ice skating is again being made available - weather permitting, of course - at the Glenmont Elementary School and at the Junior High School tennis courts. So far this winter only a few days have been "skatable," but there are sure to be many more.

The two rinks are flooded for use after school hours and on weekends, and both young people and adults are welcome to practice their figure 8's there. Mr. Fuller is grateful to both the Glenmont and Delmar Fire Departments for making hoses available at the schools, so he can use them for flooding the skating areas whenever possible.

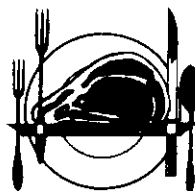

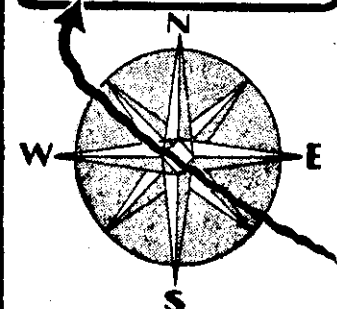
