Everyone is most welcome - and photographers are invited to bring their cameras along.

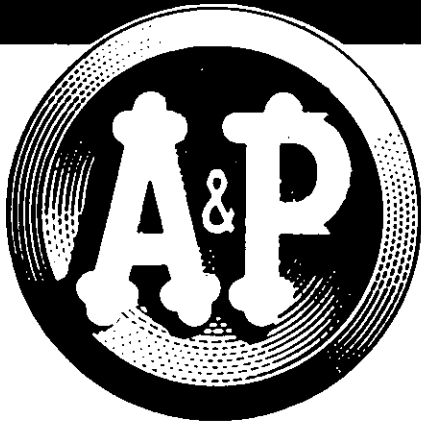
Two Ambassadors This Year

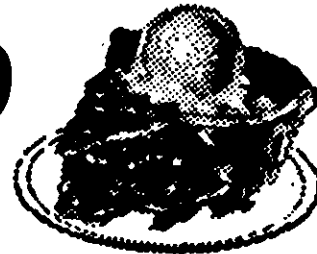

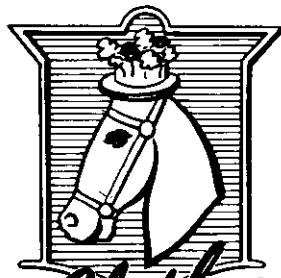

29 Teenagers Teach Swimming

Twenty-nine teenagers gave up their Easter Vacation last week so that they could learn to teach swimming, especially for the physically handicapped. They were enrolled in an American Red Cross Water Safety Aide Course held at the Bethlehem Junior High School swimming pool every morning.

Class was in session from 9 until 12 noon, with the exception of Thursday, when the youngsters took part in a demonstration for the Red Cross High School Leadership Workshop, which was held at the same location during the day.

As part of the Thursday Clinic, demonstrations were given by physically handicapped swimmers and the youngsters had lunch together. 'Boiler room' Bilking Nets \$150 Million

Each year Americans lose some \$150 million in fraudulent

stock-selling schemes, the Catholic Digest states.

One of the oldest but most effective schemes of the "boiler room" operator goes like this: he sends a letter to 1,000 persons about Company A stock. The first 500 persons are told that the stock will go down, and the rest that it will go up. A week later the stock has moved one way or the other. The 500 who were advised wrong are ignored. But the other 500 are sent a second letter about Company B; 250 are told that the stock will rise, the other half that it will fall. After the third time, the 125 who have been correctly advised all three times are given a high-pressure sales pitch. On the record of three correct tips in a row, the suckers are convinced that they should get in on the ground floor.

HARVEST FROM SEA COULD END HUNGER

Demographers can see the day when the earth will have to feed ten times as many people as it does now. We must learn how to farm the sea as efficiently as we do the land, they say in the Catholic Digest.

Feeding the world's growing billions on plankton soup is just so much talk. But fish flour is another matter. This is fish reduced to liquid protein, disinfected, and dried to flour. It can be made cheaply, is easily transported, and can be stored without refrigeration. And, it uses the whole fish, even the head, tail, stomach, and intestines. This is a distinct health advantage, for it is the parts of the fish we normally throw away that have the most vitamins.

Eating the whole fish seems repulsive to some, but stop and think. Except for the shell, we eat the whole oyster, mussel, and clam. Few people throw away any part of a soft-shelled crab, and it isn't cleaned before it's cooked. Shrimp are seldom cleaned. Many Americans eat smelt and grunion whole and uncleaned.

Fish flour can be made into fish cakes or become an odorless, tasteless supplement to cereals, breads, and soups. Coarse fish meal is already a popular livestock and chicken feed.

About half of the fish now caught by commercial fishermen are tossed overboard as trash. Another good proportion of the catch is discarded as waste in cleaning. When we learn to harvest the sea efficiently, the commercial production of fish flour will turn all this into a money crop and an important weapon against malnutrition.

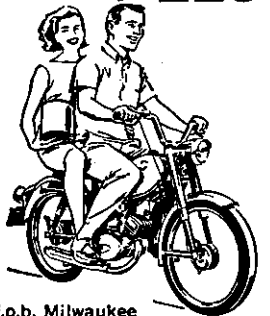

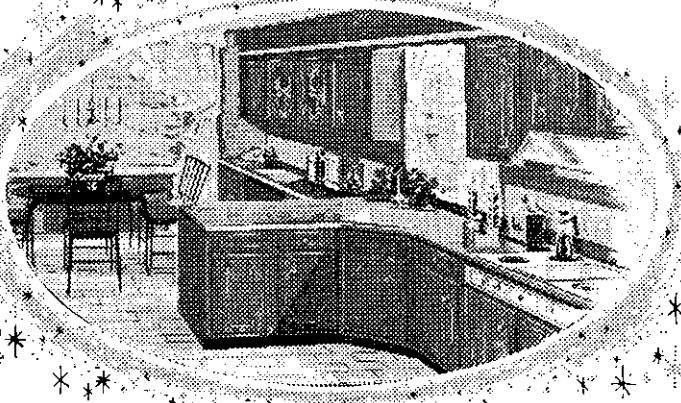

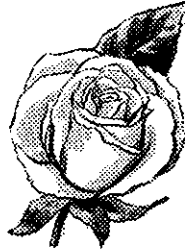

Mrs. Emery's hospital bills have totaled more than \$2,000 to date, but her many local friends and neighbors are contributing money to help pay the unexpected bill. Thornton (Tim's parents) and Mr. and Mrs. Rex Trowbridge, together with Mr. and Mrs. Samuel Hutchinson, sent a letter to almost 200 friends of Mrs. Emery to explain her present financial plight. 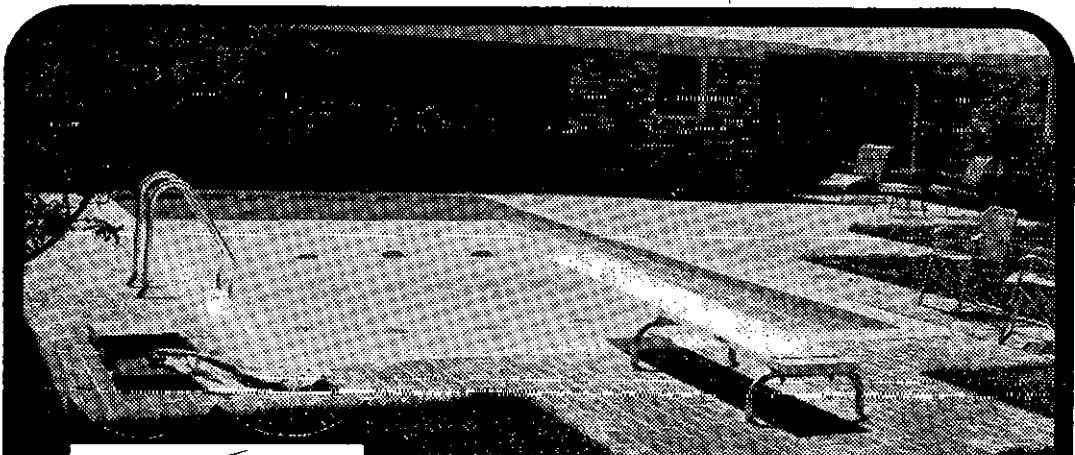

Mrs. Emery has had one bit of cheering news lately. Her other son, Bryan, received word of his appointment to the Central Intelligence Agency and reported for work in Washington D.C. just last Saturday. Bryan is a graduate of Bethlehem Central, and served an Army tour in London. He had been with his mother and brother in Miami when he got news of the eagerly-awaited appointment.

Now that the painful job of paying is over, a pat on the back is the reward to residents of the Town of Bethlehem from Receiver of Taxes, Kenneth Hahn. He's sure that the town's 97.7 per cent rate of property tax collection is the highest in the state.

"This record-setting percentage of tax collection shows the fiscal responsibility in the Town of Bethlehem," he said. 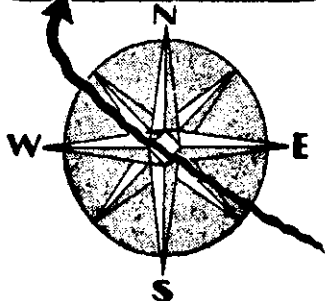

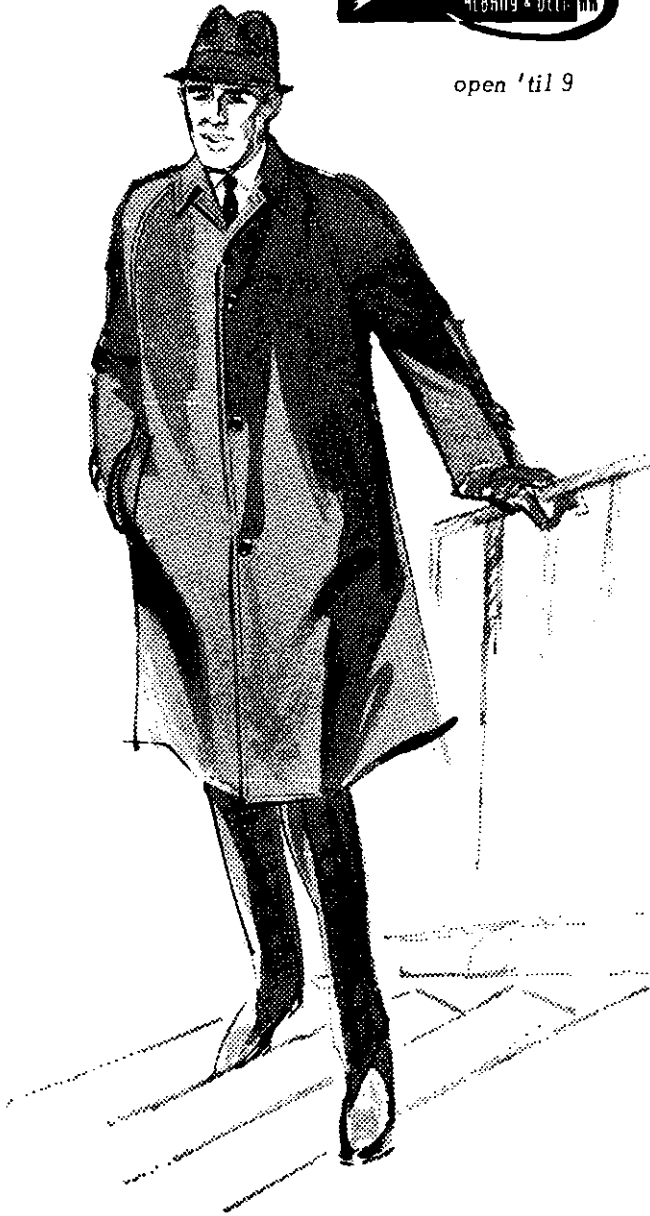
